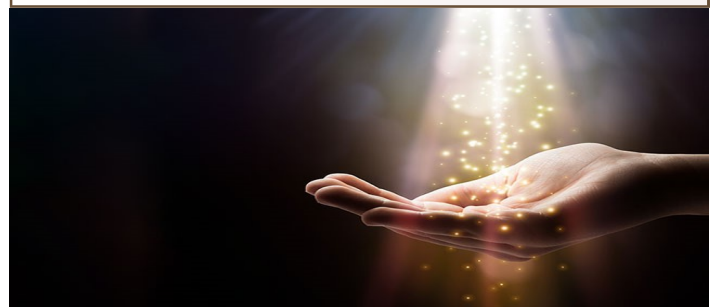
A Prayer for Healing

**FOURTH SUNDAY IN
ORDINARY TIME
LITURGY OF THE WORD**

READING I — JER 1:4-5,17-19

The word of the LORD came to me, saying:
Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you. But do you gird your loins; stand up and tell them all that I command you. Be not crushed on their account, as though I would leave you crushed before them; for it is I this day who have made you a fortified city, a pillar of iron, a wall of brass, against the whole land: against Judah's kings and princes, against its priests and people. They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you, says the LORD.

PSALM 71: I Will Sing of Your Salvation

READING II — 1 COR 12:31—13:13

Brothers and sisters:
Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy, and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.
Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
Love never fails. If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing. For we know partially and we prophesy partially, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things. At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known. So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

GOSPEL — LK 4:21-30

Jesus began speaking in the synagogue, saying:
"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." And all spoke highly of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They also asked, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?" He said to them, "Surely you will quote me this proverb, 'Physician, cure yourself,' and say, 'Do here in your native place the things that we heard were done in Capernaum.'" And he said, "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own native place. Indeed, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was closed for three and a half years and a severe famine spread over the entire land. It was to none of these that Elijah was sent, but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon. Again, there were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet; yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian." When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were all filled with fury. They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built, to hurl him down headlong. But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away.

THE MOST EXCELLENT OF SPIRITUAL GIFTS IS LOVE.

Today, the first reading and the Gospel focus on the gift of prophecy given to both Jeremiah and Jesus to bring a particular message from God to the people. Perhaps prophecy is one of the most difficult gifts to receive from God, because, as we can see from the readings, good prophets are not always welcome, either in their native place, as Jesus discovered, or in places that receive difficult or challenging messages from God. But while prophets might not receive accolades from the people to whom they are sent, they do receive the assurance that God is with them to give them the strength and courage they need in their mission.

This assurance is implicit in our Rite of Baptism. By our baptism, we are anointed priest, prophet and king. That is our mission; these are the roles we have in evangelizing the world. Saint Paul gives us some insight into this. No matter what other gifts we might have, we are called to use them and the opportunities God gives us in love – for God and good of others, and for the salvation of the world. The kind of love that Paul calls us to is challenging; it is not meant simply to enrich us, make us feel good or inflate our egos.

It is meant to benefit the other, to focus on what's best for the other person.

This is our challenge as Christians: to check everything we do, all the spiritual gifts we bring to the Church, to our families or to our workplaces, with the gift of love, of practical concern for the benefit of others. As we go about the rest of our week, let us ask God for the special spiritual gift of love to accompany everything we do.

THE HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

1. What spiritual gifts has God given you and how have you lovingly shared those gifts with others?
2. Can you recall a moment or moments when you have shared something with others and experienced a loving reaction rather than one of condemnation? What was that like?
3. As you reflect upon the connection of love and your talents, have you ever experienced that connection in your own life? Does love always accompany everything you do?
4. What is love?

AS WE GO ABOUT THE REST OF OUR WEEK, LET US ASK GOD FOR THE SPECIAL SPIRITUAL GIFT OF LOVE TO ACCOMPANY EVERYTHING WE DO.

16 Things That Make My Daily Life Better. They might help your life better, too. (Part 1)

Most mornings, I'm not exactly thrilled when my alarm goes off. I don't jump up and down in excitement when something else gets added to my plate at work or it's time to pay bills or someone bails on me. Things happen on a daily basis that get on my nerves . . . even if they are the smallest of offenses. The ensuing anxiety and frustration can blind me from all the goodness, beauty, and wonder that surrounds me daily, and they ultimately rob me of my life—the life I want to live. The life that is good and joyful and chock-full of countless opportunities to practice gratitude. Gratitude is the reality check that the sullen, angsty teenager living inside of me needs. In this moment of gratitude, we are surrounded by good things. We only need to pause long enough to make note of them.

I know I often need help remembering this. Maybe you do, too. If so, here is a list of things you and I can be grateful for right now (even if you're having a really annoying day).

1. MUSIC

There really is nothing so wonderful as a good song. I mean songs that somehow understand what you're experiencing and can convey that beautifully. How does that even happen?! There are songs I've listened to probably hundreds of times . . . because I can (and because they're amazing). A couple of my current favorites are "Farther Along" by Josh Garrels and "The Storehouse" by Gray Havens.

2. SUNSHINE

Walking outside and feeling the warmth on your face . . . it's incredible. Especially after a few days of rain (which happen often here in Cincinnati where I live and work). The shining sun is something I hope I never take for granted again.

3. LAUGHTER

A good laugh is a cure for even the most tiresome of days. When a coworker makes me genuinely laugh, my whole day is vastly improved. I am very blessed that I am presented with countless opportunities to laugh daily. Even on the days where it's more difficult to find those opportunities for mirth, I spend a few minutes looking at memes and suddenly everything's okay again.

4. WORDS

Have you ever read something that resonated with you at a deep level? It doesn't really matter who wrote them or when, words have a way of nourishing and inspiring us that I can't help but be in awe of. There are quotes and passages from books that I can confidently say have changed my life for the better. Example: Sometimes I'll look up quotes by some of my favorite authors for a little inspiration. A recent find is the following from au C. S. Lewis: "Each day we are becoming a creature of splendid glory or one of unthinkable horror."

5. WONDER

When was the last time you were in awe of something? It's so easy for us (at least for me) to become jaded as adults. We rarely let ourselves be awestruck—it's not "cool." But being truly in awe of something—the stars, a mountain, a beautiful song or story—is actually the appropriate response to the wondrous things in life . . . and it's so freeing.

6. GREEN SPACE

Wide open spaces just make my soul happy. Parks, the countryside, backyards . . . somehow I can't help but be more relaxed and carefree when I'm surrounded by green. Science has proven that green space improves our mood, satisfaction, and personal sense of peace. Example: Yesterday I picked up some donuts and went to a park with an incredible view—my roommate and I made the most of an incredibly beautiful fall evening, and it was just what I needed.

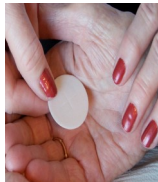

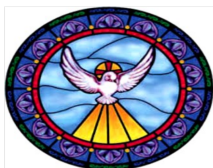

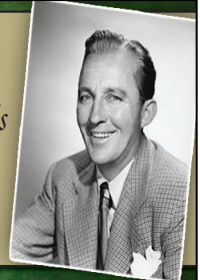
