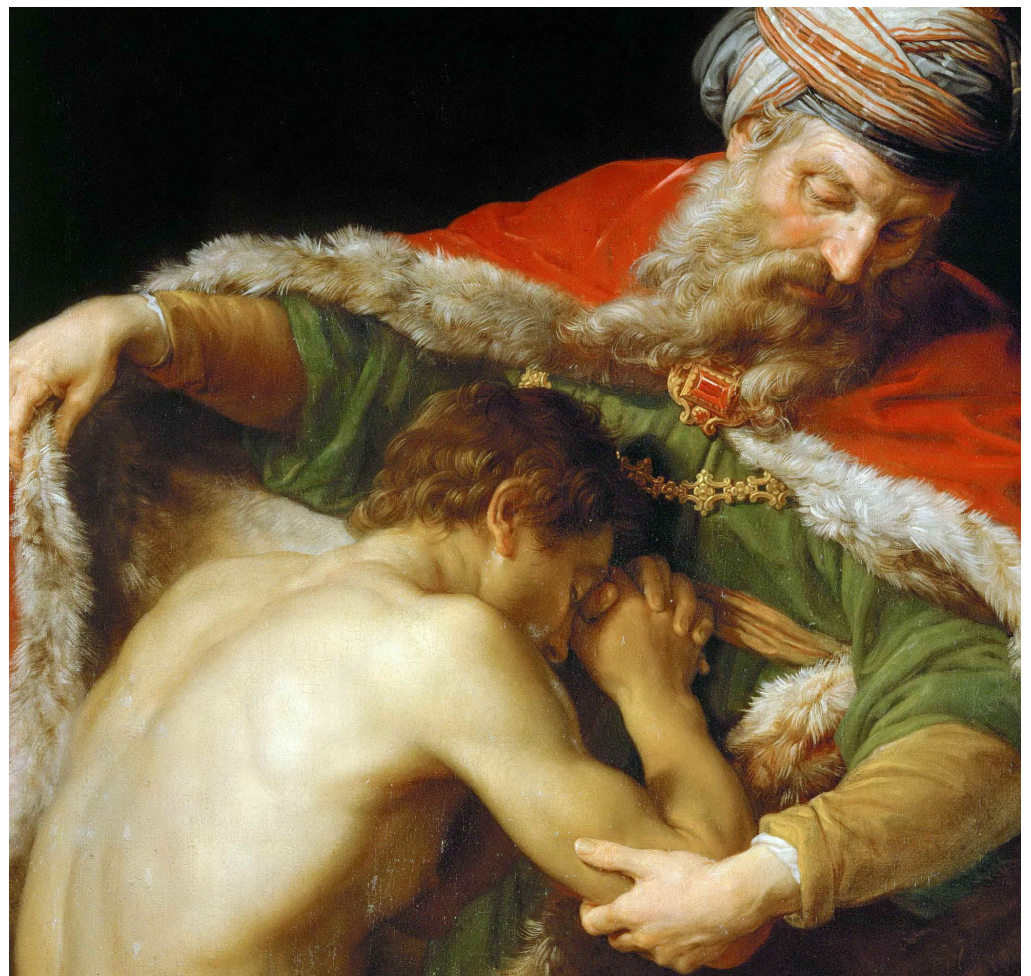

# This Sunday's Liturgy

## FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT LITURGY OF THE WORD

### READING I — JOS 5:9A, 10-12

The LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you." While the Israelites were encamped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, they celebrated the Passover on the evening of the fourteenth of the month. On the day after the Passover, they ate of the produce of the land in the form of unleavened cakes and parched grain. On that same day after the Passover, on which they ate of the produce of the land, the manna ceased. No longer was there manna for the Israelites, who that year ate of the yield of the land of Canaan.

### PSALM 34: Taste and See #34

### READING II — 2COR 5:17-21

Brothers and sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

### GOSPEL — LK 15:1-3, 11-32

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.'" So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught

sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'"

## LENT

A TIME OF REPENTANCE, GRACE & RENEWAL

### **God provides for us, but also gives us free will.**

Today's readings remind us that we have a loving God who supplies all our needs but also gives us free will. He knows our weaknesses, and is always ready to receive us with forgiveness and mercy – when we turn to him with trust, repentance and humility.

The first reading in particular is a reminder that God provides for us. For years while the Israelites were in the desert, God had provided manna, which miraculously showed up in the desert so the people could keep up their strength during their journey in the desert. But once they arrived in the land that had been promised to them and had access to the fruits of the land, God ceased the necessity of providing the extraordinary gift of manna and allowed the people of Israel to be nurtured through their free cooperation with nature and the natural order of crops.

Similarly, Jesus shows us how God – through the character of the father in the parable of the prodigal son – takes care of us without forcing himself on us or preventing our turning away from him.

The father honors the unreasonable request of his younger son (who by Jewish law has no claim on any inheritance) and divides his estate between the two sons. He doesn't prevent the younger son from leaving home to live a life of sin in a foreign country, but gives him the freedom to make mistakes. He doesn't chase after his son or send out detectives to find him and bring him back – but lets the son use his free will to embark on the path he has chosen. Once the son realizes his mistake and comes back home, however, the father meets him more than halfway and welcomes him whole-heartedly, without judgment or reproach.

God works the same way with us. He provides for us, but he does not force us into a relationship with him. By his grace we are invited; by our will and his grace do we respond.

### **THE HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

During Lent, we are invited in a special way to turn back to God in whatever way may be necessary – to take the first step of reconciliation with God or with others. God waits for us patiently in the sacrament of reconciliation, and is ready to absolve us and make us “new creations” as we confess our sins and ask for God's forgiveness and strength.

**Let us pray and encourage one another to live out God's call to us in Lent: to provide manna for one another and to turn back to God with all our hearts, minds and souls.**

## FRASSATI GOLDEN APPLE GALA

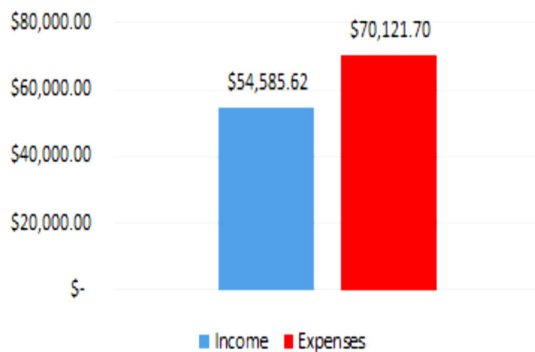

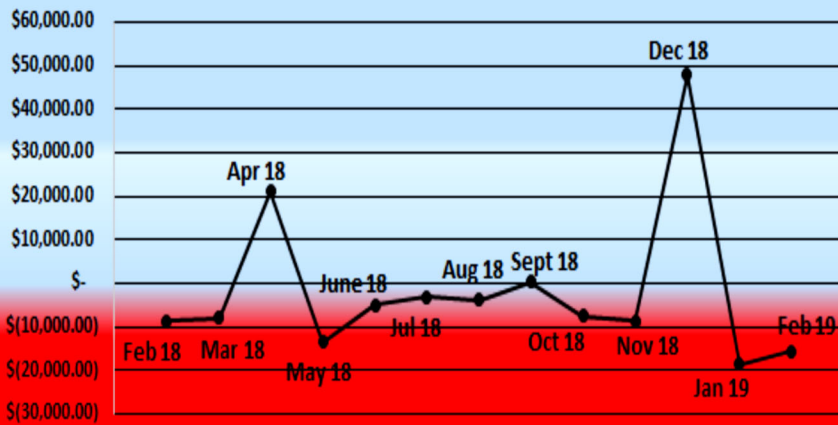

# LIVE YOUR BEST LENT

## How to Choose The-Best -Version-of-Yourself

THREE BIG QUESTIONS:

### 1. WHO IS YOUR BEST SELF?

If you don't know where you're going, how will you know which direction to go and how will you know when you get there? Likewise, if you don't know who you want to be, if you don't know who you are truly capable of being, it makes it pretty difficult to become that person. You can't even take the first step toward bettering yourself.

**Success is this: becoming the best version of yourself.**

First, think about the *best* people you know. Not the happiest or most successful, though they may be happy and successful. But the best people. What do they have in common? Are they courageous or cowardly? Patient or impatient? Humble or prideful? Selfish or generous? Are they strong leaders who value hard work, or do they get by with the least amount of effort possible? Write down the characteristics they have in common. Now think about your best self.

### 2. WHAT IS YOUR BEST SELF'S PURPOSE?

I have a purpose. You have a purpose. We all have a purpose. You were made for *something*. So, how do you know when you're doing what you were made for? If you're currently miserable, there's a good chance you're not fulfilling your purpose.

**Your purpose is your North Star. It is your compass. Each decision you make should be guided by your purpose.**

Spend some time in silence this week and ask yourself:

"Why am I here?" Other questions that can guide you are: "What makes me truly happy?" "If I could do one thing and know I wouldn't fail, what would it be?" "What am I doing when I feel like I am at my best—emotionally, physically, intellectually, and spiritually?" "When was the last time I experienced real joy?" "When do I feel most at peace?" "If I knew I was going to die exactly one year from today, what would I stop doing right now?"

### 3. WHAT PREVENTS YOU FROM BEING YOUR BEST SELF?

Nobody wants to be a-second-rate-version-of-themselves. I have never met anyone who has consciously said, "Today, I am going to make bad choices that hurt myself and everyone I love."

**You design your life with the choices you make. You are the builder; your choices are the bricks.**

Yet, when faced with choosing the-best-version-of-ourselves and a-second-rate-version-of-ourselves, how often do we choose the latter? While many things in life are out of your control, who you are and how you react to the world is your choice. You design your life with the choices you make.

You are the builder; your choices are the bricks. I make the wrong choice all the time, whether it's saying the wrong thing to my wife (and knowing full well beforehand), or getting upset when driving ("Hi. My name is Peter and I have road rage"), or choosing Cheez-Its instead of an apple (Italian Four Cheese, if you're wondering). So what is it for you? Take some time and really think about it. What is it that you consistently choose that prevents you from being the-best-version-of-yourself? Unhealthy foods, pornography, debt and impulsive spending, jealousy, laziness, social media, gossip, anger, negativity, procrastinating, doubt and self-image issues?

Once you recognize the enemy, once you give the enemy its name, once you accept that you are choosing to put these obstacles between you and your best self, you can fight back. How? Virtue.

Every vice that leads to a-second-rate-version-of-yourself has an opposite virtue that leads to the-best-version-of-yourself. Struggling with selfishness? Practice generosity. Is pride preventing your best self from shining forth? Practice humility. Are you battling an addiction? Practice self-mastery and discipline. Notice the word I used three times there? *Practice*. Practice doesn't make perfect. Practice makes better. Better is your goal. Rid yourself of obstacles. If pornography is getting in the way of you being the-best-version-of-yourself, get rid of your computer. If social media is getting in the way, delete your account. If impulsive spending and debt are crippling your best self, get rid of your credit cards and create a budget. Take control of your life. When you're struggling, say this to yourself: **Grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.**

So where do you go from here? It all feels so unattainable, doesn't it? It seems so difficult and complex. But it doesn't have to be. The trick is just doing the next right thing. Not the ten or one hundred next right things. Just the next right thing—one at a time—on the path to the-best-version-of-yourself.

- You know what the-best-version-of-yourself looks like (and what it doesn't look like).
- You know why your best self exists and what you should be doing to fulfill your best self's purpose.
- And you know what might get in your best-self's way and how to rid yourself of obstacles by practicing virtue.

There's only one thing left to do: The next right thing.

## ABSTINENCE

The law of abstinence requires a Catholic 14 years of age until death to abstain from eating meat on Fridays in honor of the Passion of Jesus on Good Friday. **During Lent** abstinence from meat on Fridays is obligatory in the United States as elsewhere.

## FASTING

The law of fasting requires a Catholic from the 18th Birthday to the 59th Birthday to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks which could be considered food (milk shakes, but not milk). Alcoholic beverages do not break the fast; however, they seem to be contrary to the spirit of doing penance.

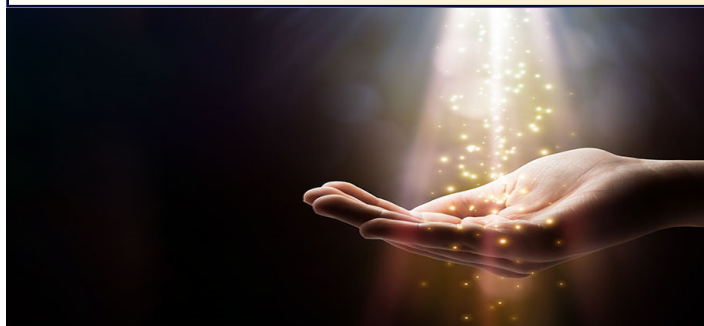
