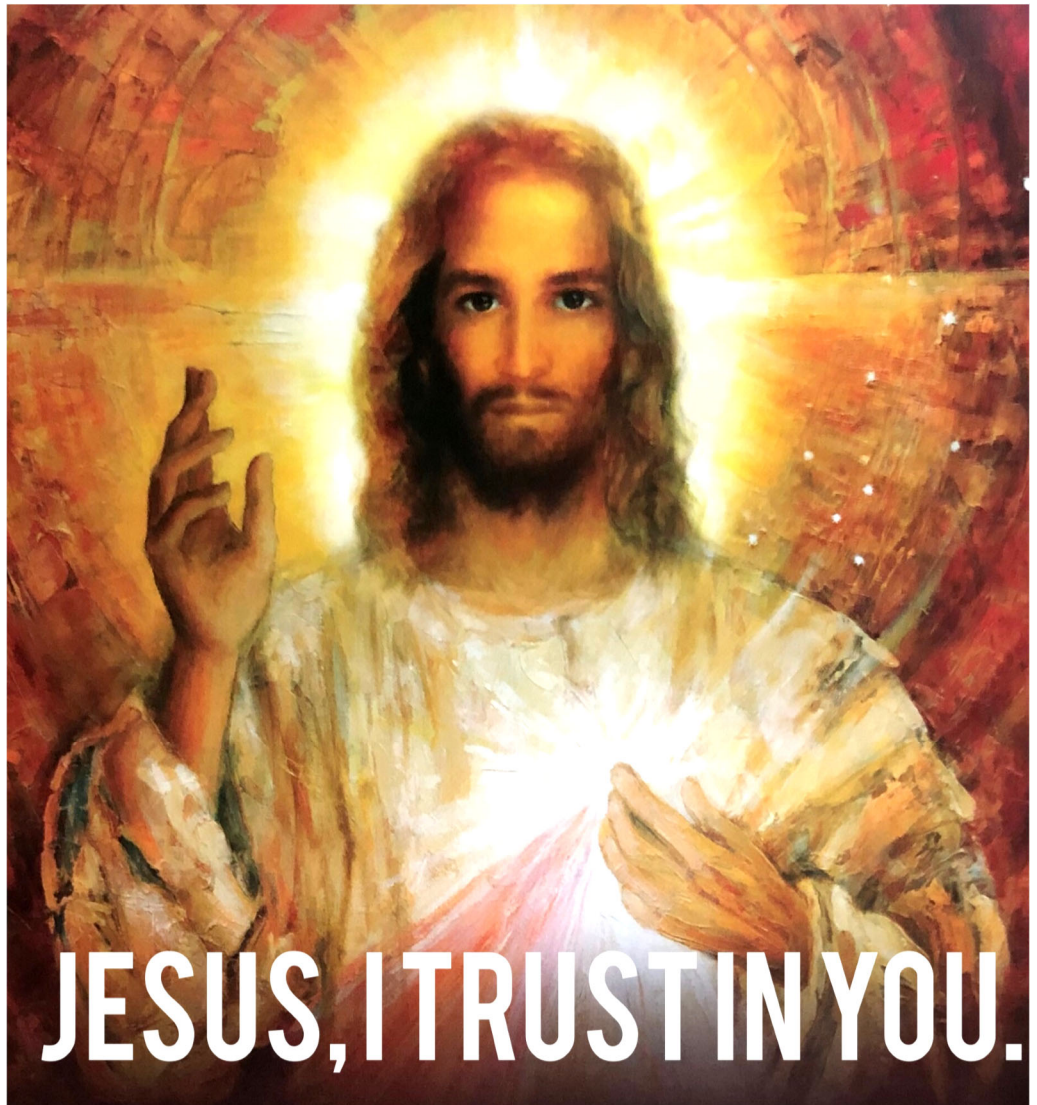

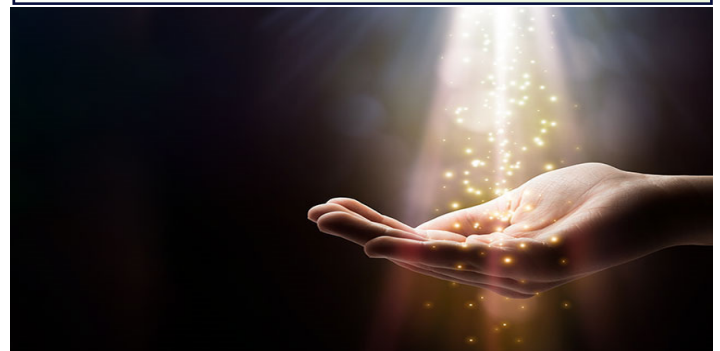

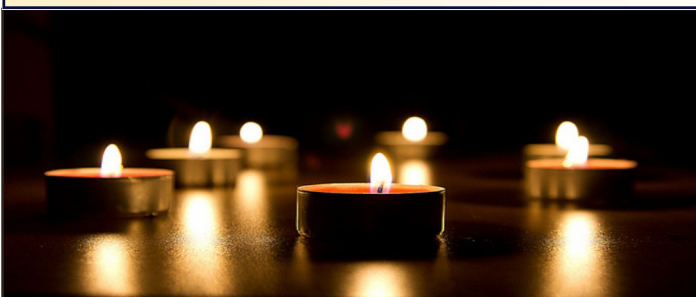

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I — ACTS 5:12-16

Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles. They were all together in Solomon's portico. None of the others dared to join them, but the people esteemed them. Yet more than ever, believers in the Lord, great numbers of men and women, were added to them. Thus they even carried the sick out into the streets and laid them on cots and mats so that when Peter came by, at least his shadow might fall on one or another of them. A large number of people from the towns in the vicinity of Jerusalem also gathered, bringing the sick and those disturbed by unclean spirits, and they were all cured.

PSALM 118: Let Us Rejoice #65

READING II — REV 1:9-11A, 12-13, 17-19

I, John, your brother, who share with you the distress, the kingdom, and the endurance we have in Jesus, found myself on the island called Patmos because I proclaimed God's word and gave testimony to Jesus. I was caught up in spirit on the Lord's day and heard behind me a voice as loud as a trumpet, which said, "Write on a scroll what you see." Then I turned to see whose voice it was that spoke to me, and when I turned, I saw seven gold lampstands and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, wearing an ankle-length robe, with a gold sash around his chest. When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever. I hold the keys to death and the netherworld. Write down, therefore, what you have seen, and what is happening, and what will happen afterwards."

GOSPEL

— JN 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

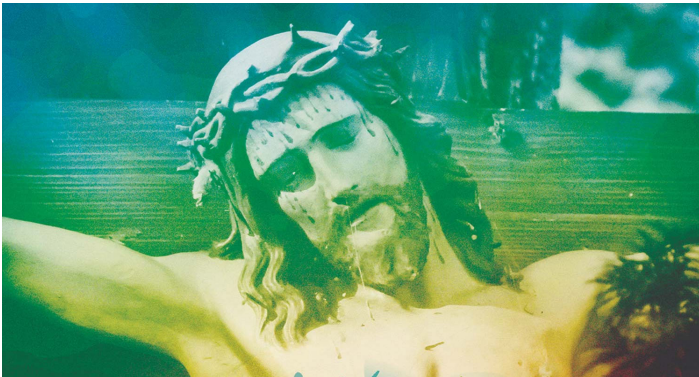

JESUS' PEACE AND OUR TOTAL TRUST IN HIM LIBERATES US FROM OUR PRISON OF FEAR.

In the readings for the Mass today, fear is contrasted with confidence. In the first reading, despite the signs and wonders performed by the Apostles, some are unable to join them as believers, while others confidently are added to the number. A similar fear is evident in the seven churches of Asia in the reading from Revelation when John acknowledges their distress and speaks with confidence about his testimony and imprisonment on Patmos.

John's confidence comes from his encounter with the risen Jesus in today's Gospel. This encounter carried the greeting, Peace be with you. Now this greeting is more than just a wish or a hope. It is a statement. It does not mean "may peace be with you." It means "peace is with you." The immediate effect of Jesus' presence and words is shown in their "rejoicing." And for this reason, John and his fellow Apostles have confidence that Jesus' peace will abide with them, providing the strength to face any fears life may present.

Thomas, who was not with them when Jesus appeared to the others, refuses to believe their testimony. While we do not know the exact reason, Thomas was not present with the Apostles when Jesus came, nor why he does not believe what he is told, we do know what happens when Jesus appears again.

This time, Thomas is present and professes his belief in the Resurrection after touching Jesus' wounds. But, before Jesus invited Thomas to touch his wounds, he greeted him with, Peace be with you. Again, this simple phrase, as it did for the other Apostles, instilled within Thomas a sense of confidence that would ultimately lead him to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.

We all face encounters, events and people that can create distress and leave us fearful. But Thomas, John, Peter and the other disciples teach us today that Jesus came to liberate us from our spiritual and emotional prisons of fear. Jesus invites us to embrace the peace he offers and join with the other believers, who walk with confidence knowing the peace of Jesus dispels any fears. Jesus' desire for us to enjoy his peace is echoed in his words when he told Sister Faustina, in one his appearances to her: "My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed; a great struggle for my kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone" (Diary, 1488).

THE HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

1. Do you trust God? One of the most beautiful prayers you can pray comes from the Divine Mercy devotion: Jesus, I trust in You. So, do you? And if you do, what effect does this have on your life? How do you trust? How deep is your trust? How did you arrive at the level of trust that you have?

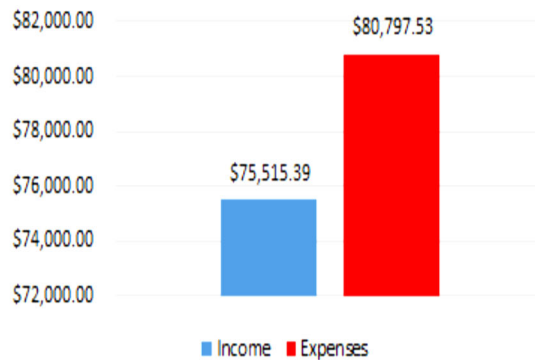

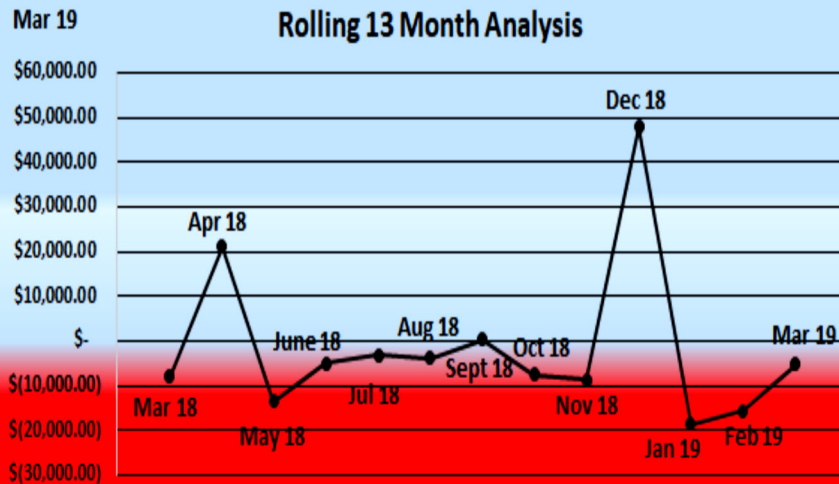

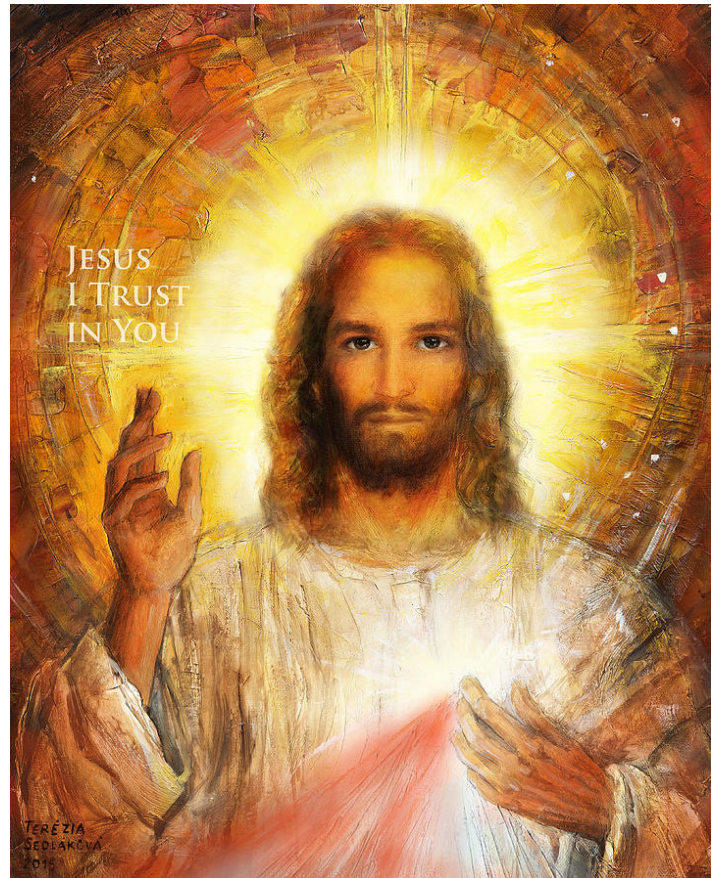

Overcome Your Fear: 5 Steps to be Confident & Pursue Your Dreams

Want to overcome your fears and be confident? What is the difference between a person who is **confident** and one who is not? Self-confident people **confront their fears** and overcome all obstacles in life. When you are confident, you tend to take life on a positive note, regardless of how things are going in your life. Everyone has certain fears and we all face obstacles, but the secret to success lies in being able to beat them and achieve what is desired. The lack of confidence can hold you from **pursuing your dreams**. However, you can work on enhancing your self-confidence and self-esteem issues and become surer of yourself. No one but you can make yourself be confident.

Here are five steps that will help you be confident and pursue your dreams:

1. Make a Positive Frame of Mind

If you want to become self-confident, you need to learn to stay away from negativity. This means staying away from the people who put you down and the thoughts that have the potential to shred your confidence. Instead, spend time with people who are positive and instill a sense of positivity in you.

Here is how you can stay in a positive frame of mind:

Control negative thoughts. It's not bad to doubt yourself sometimes, but do not let those thoughts take over the positive ones.

Use positive language when interacting with people. What you speak is governed by how you actually feel.

Worrying is natural, but do not let your worries take over your feelings. In order to stay confident, you need to control your worries.

Constantly remind yourself of all the good things you do or have happened to you and see the positive change in your attitude.

2. Know Your Strengths and Weaknesses

Do not depend on others to point out your strengths and weaknesses. Get to know yourself well instead. You can become a lot more confident by overcoming your weaknesses and trusting your capabilities. Make a list of the things that you are good at and enjoy doing, and another list of the things where you need improvement. The idea is to work on areas that make you less confident. As you turn your weaknesses into your strengths, you experience a sense of fulfillment and you'll gradually be confident. Do not run away from criticism; it is an opportunity to improve. Instead of trying to hold down people who do better than you, try learning from them.

Do not take failure too seriously, but as an opportunity to do even better the next time.

3. Manage Your Life and Balance the Time

You tend to lose confidence when you are unable to **achieve your goals** (whether at work or in your personal life). Poor time management leads to stress, and the more stressed you are, the likelihood of negativity taking a toll on you increases. Regardless of the part of the world you stay in, you will have to juggle a lot of responsibilities – managing work, children, household chores, etc. With effective time management, you can achieve all your goals and, as a result, boost your self-confidence. Make a list of the things you need to get done on any given day and then assign a specific time to each task. 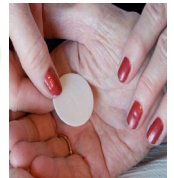
