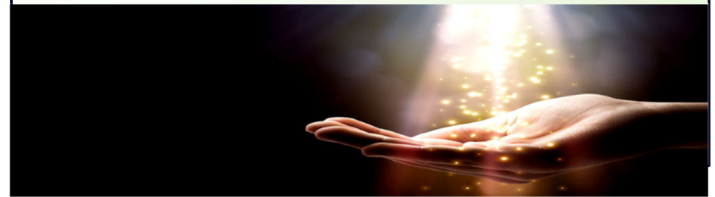

LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I —WIS 9:13-18B

Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the LORD intends? For the deliberations of mortals are timid, and unsure are our plans. For the corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns. And scarce do we guess the things on earth, and what is within our grasp we find with difficulty; but when things are in heaven, who can search them out? Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high? And thus were the paths of those on earth made straight.

PSALM: 90 : In Every Age

READING II —PHMN 9-10, 12-17

I, Paul, an old man, and now also a prisoner for Christ Jesus, urge you on behalf of my child Onesimus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment; I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I should have liked to retain him for myself, so that he might serve me on your behalf in my imprisonment for the gospel, but I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that the good you do might not be forced but voluntary. Perhaps this is why he was away from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a brother, beloved especially to me, but even more so to you, as a man and in the Lord. So if you regard me as a partner, welcome him as you would me.

GOSPEL — LK 14:25-33

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me

without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

DISCIPLESHIP IS *WHY* WE DO WHAT WE DO.

Each of us has a list of responsibilities that are important. We have work and families, organizations we support and people who depend on us. We try to fulfill all our duties properly. This is part of living a good, Christian life.

Undoubtedly there are times when we could give more, and maybe even sometimes when it would be best to give a little less. But we feel committed to doing what's asked of us, and when we do these things, we feel we've done what we should – what God asks of us.

And yet, in today's Gospel Jesus tells us that this is not enough. Simply fulfilling what is required as a parent, child, employee, committee chairperson or neighbor is not the essence of discipleship.

Listen again to what Jesus says: *If any one comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.*

The force of a text like this reframes the ordinary world we know. Jesus' words should shake us up. So let's let them. According to Jesus, what is discipleship?

Discipleship is not just one more hobby or extracurricular activity. Discipleship is *why* we do what we do, mindful of the costs it brings.

What Jesus commands is prioritizing him as the

source of our life, and as its ultimate end. It is making our love for him the ordering principle of everything else we do. For without him, nothing else matters.

HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

First Reading: Wisdom 9:13-18b

It is hard enough “to guess what is in our grasp”—according to the Letter to the Hebrews, “let alone the things of heaven.” Can you relate to that statement? Is there anything you are uncertain about in the political arena in your country? Is there anything you are uncertain about in your spiritual life? Does God give you help when you are unclear? Which do you think God prefers in you, perfect certainty— or your best guess, trusting in God?

Second Reading: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

How did Paul bring about a change or a conversion in Onesimus? What part does love play in any change for the better? Has love worked any changes in your life? Slavery was an accepted institution in Paul's time but he states a revolutionary idea anyway: there are no divisions in Christ. What causes social divisions in the world today? Can you do anything to change that?

Gospel : Luke 14: 25-33

Is following Jesus a one-time choice or do you have to make it daily? Which would you rather have, all the possessions you could ever want, without Christ, or Christ with no possessions? Can you name some people who lived/live in Christ and have possessed nothing? What does this freedom allow them to do? “Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.” Do crosses make discipleship desirable? Is there anything that makes us want discipleship, even though it involves crosses?

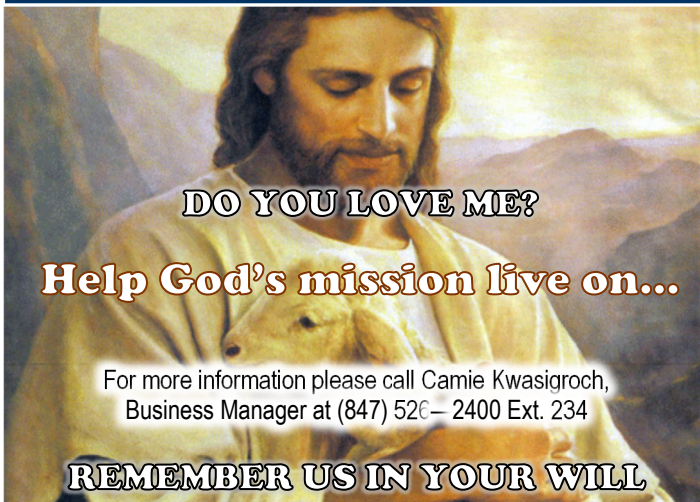
SOMOS DISCIPULOS COMPROMETIDOS

When we first hear this statement, it seems that Jesus is making an unrealistic demand upon us. How can we renounce all of our possessions? We need them to live. However, what we must renounce is the belief that they belong to us. Everything that we have belongs to God alone. All of our resources are entrusted to us not only for our own use, but also so that we can help others. Once we renounce the idea that we possess or are entitled to anything, it is much easier to live **Stewardship** and share the many gifts that God has given us. Then we truly are His Disciples.

I am writing briefly to our entire congregation during this time as the Summer is about to end and we are starting our FY-2019-2020 to express appreciation for your faithfulness over the years in generous giving of Tithes and Offerings to Transfiguration Parish.

It is evident that the Hand of God is upon this parish community as we look around and see obvious tangible evidence of his provision through the obedience of His people.

Many of our parishioners can testify to the faithfulness of God in their own lives as they have given to the Lord generously to our local church. Numerous verses in the Old Testament refer to the practice of tithing. Jesus Himself in the New Testament told of the importance of tithing when He rebuked the Hypocritical Pharisees in Luke 11:42 – *But woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass over judgment and the love of God: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.*

This scripture makes it clear that even in the New Testament age, we are to consider judgment and the love of God, and not to leave the other “undone”. While some have said that Tithing passed away with the Law, it is hardly the case as the very first “tither” was Abraham who gave tithes to Melchizedek (before the Law was instituted), and the above statement of Christ in New Testament times. Christ clearly had opportunity to abolish the system of tithing, however, it is clear that He affirmed it.

Beyond this, anyone who has ever tithed as well as given offerings to the House of God can truly testify that God is faithful in supplying the needs for their own individual households. The Bible says in: Malachi 3:10 – *Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.*

Again, we praise God for His faithfulness to Transfiguration Church, and look forward to greater Ministry in the future.

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter, and regardless of your giving abilities, we welcome you at Transfiguration Church.

Being Successful

We Christians tend to gloss over the most startling one-liners passed down to us from Jesus such as the one that closes today's Gospel: "None of you can be my disciple if he does not renounce all his possessions."

The statement shocks, and yet it reflects that basic human wisdom which tells us that "the corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns."

The issue, then, is true freedom, the ability to follow Onesimus (Second Reading) out of slavery. The other issue involved here is true worship, the question of priority in our lives: who or what is more important. God or our possessions?

Today's liturgy encourages us to put God first, to long for God "like a deer that longs for running streams," and to recognize that "in every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge."

It is not evil to want God to prosper the work of our hands. It is evil to make a god of creatures and to replace worship of the true God with worship of worldly possessions.

It is not merely a matter of 'giving from one's surplus,' but of helping entire peoples, who are presently excluded or marginalized, to enter into the sphere of economic and human development.

For this to happen, it is not enough to draw on the surplus goods which in fact our world abundantly produces; it requires above all a change of lifestyles, of models of production and consumption, and of the established structures of power which today govern societies

There are some people—the few who possess much—who do not really succeed in 'being' because, through a reversal of the hierarchy of values, they are hindered by the cult of having. ...

The evil does not consist in 'having' as such, but in possessing without regard for the quality and the ordered hierarchy of the goods one has.
