

## **READING I** — **WIS 11:22-12:2**

Before the LORD the whole universe is as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth. But you have mercy on all, because you can do all things; and you overlook people's sins that they may repent. For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made; for what you hated, you would not have fashioned. And how could a thing remain, unless you willed it; or be preserved, had it not been called forth by you? But you spare all things, because they are yours, O LORD and lover of souls, for your imperishable spirit is in all things! Therefore you rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O LORD!

## READING II — 2 THES 1:11-2:2

Brothers and sisters: We always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith, that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, in accord with the grace of our God and Lord Jesus Christ. We ask you, brothers and sisters, with regard to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our assembling with him, not to be shaken out of your minds suddenly, or to be alarmed either by a "spirit," or by an oral statement, or by a letter allegedly from us to the effect that the day of the Lord is at hand.

## GOSPEL – LK 19:1-10

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a

wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down guickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

## PASTOR'S COLUMN



# TODAY SALVATION HAS COME TO THIS HOUSE.

God is a God who *love[s]* all things that are, he is a *lover* of souls. God is merciful and overlooks our sins to give us the opportunity to repent. God's love sustains and holds us into being at every moment. Breathes into us the breath of life, every moment like Adam's first breath. This love of God empties itself into our humanity in Jesus. God takes the initiative and comes to meet us – not just halfway, but all the way, in Jesus.

Today we heard the story of Jesus' encounter with Zacchaeus; let's focus for a moment on the details of this passage. This story takes place in the town of Jericho, which is perhaps most famous for the opening battle of the Israelite occupation of the Promised Land. During that battle, the Hebrew army issued battle trumpets, normally restricted to squad leaders, to every soldier. At night they marched around the city, blowing their trumpets. The inhabitants of Jericho were so frightened that they surrendered without a fight. The walls came tumbling down.

Perhaps Luke, in his Gospel, wants us to see how other walls can come tumbling down. He writes, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Zacchaeus, a chief tax collector and a wealthy man, wants to see Jesus. By this time in Jesus' ministry, who wouldn't, right? But Zacchaeus couldn't see Jesus, because he was too short to see over the crowds. So we hear that he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see him.

Jesus sees Zacchaeus in the tree, orders him down from it, and then says, today I must stay at your house. Hmm ... it appears he is no longer "passing through," as he initially intended! Zacchaeus came down quickly and received [Jesus] with joy. He repents, offers to give half his

possessions to the poor, and *repay ... four times over*, anyone he has defrauded.

And while the crowd grumbles at what they see, complaining of Jesus' association with sinners, they miss history repeating itself in front of their eyes: for here in Jericho, Jesus has broken the walls of sin and greed that have surrounded Zacchaeus, and Zacchaeus has surrendered to Jesus' trumpet call to become a disciple. Jesus tells him, *Today salvation has come to this house.* 

Whatever tree we need to climb to see Jesus, whatever tree we need to descend in order to embrace him, salvation awaits us. Jesus seeks us out, and with the gift of faith we respond. For into the heart and house of one who repents and welcomes the Son of Man, salvation has come. Salvation has come to *this* house, and will soon be present on *that* altar. In grace we are called to it, with grace may we receive it and announce it to the world.

## **HEART OF THE MATTER:** TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

First Reading: Wisdom 11:22-12:2

"For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made." What things do we think of when we hear this? If God's attitude toward every created thing is love, what is your attitude? Do you show reverence for creation? For your neighbor?

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2

Paul wanted the Thessalonians to know that he was constantly praying for them. Does it help you to know people are praying for you? Explain. Does it help you to pray for other people? How?

**Gospel:** Luke 19:1-10

A man climbs a tree in order to see. A holy man goes to a "sinner's" house for dinner. A repenting person gives half of all his possessions to the poor. How do you explain these events? Does knowing Jesus Christ elicit extraordinary behavior from you? What?

## 7. LECTOR AND EUCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING:





## SPIRITUAL GROWTH

#### **True Greatness**

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus comes to Zacchaeus's house for dinner, and it is an enormous honor for Zacchaeus that he does.

Great honors come to great people. If you are a great scientist, you might win the Nobel prize. If you are a great athlete, you might win an Olympic gold medal. The people who get these honors seem amazing to us. And yet these are not the big honors. They pale in comparison to having God incarnate come to dinner.

So what is it about Zacchaeus that makes him win an honor bigger than the Nobel prize or the Olympic gold medal? What are the standards of greatness on God's standards of value?

The Second Reading explains it. As Paul tells them, he prays for the Thessalonians that they might be made worthy of the calling of God. And how are they made worthy? By living in such a way that the name of Jesus is glorified in their lives.

How does a life glorify the name of Jesus? Well, people looking at you will not think the God you worship is great if you humiliate your wife in public, neglect your children, spend most of your free time on TV, gossip maliciously about others, and try hard to get as much attention for yourself as you can, will they? Who would want to be like you? Who would want to worship the God you say you worship?

So to be great by God's standards of value is to live in such a way that others looking at you can see and admire the greatness of the Lord.

Now look at Zacchaeus. He didn't attract anyone's admiration. He was a tax collector, and he got rich from the oppression of his own people. He didn't care much for his own dignity either. Short as he was, he climbed a tree to see Jesus.

But this is the point of the story and the answer to the question about greatness, isn't it?

A person's winning human prizes (and being tall) isn't what glorifies the Lord. What glorifies the Lord is a person's seeking the Lord first, above all other prizes.

Zacchaeus doesn't care what happens to him as long as he can get to the Lord. That is what makes Zacchaeus great. And that is why Jesus came to dinner at his house.




## Taking a closer look at... the Opening Prayer

Today's focus is on the Opening Prayer of the Mass. At this point, we have entered our beautiful worship space, attempted to leave our worries behind, greeted members of our church community, reminded ourselves of our baptism with holy water and our belonging to Jesus Christ in the sign of the cross; welcomed Jesus into an active presence among us through the priest, recalled our sinfulness in the light of our faith and asked for forgiveness; showed our trust in the mercy of God with our prayer Kyrie Eleison, Lord, Have Mercy; and praised our loving God in the most ancient prayer of the universal church, the Gloria. What is left? The celebrant says: "Let us pray!" - yes one more prayer -- and a pause. In this pause we have the opportunity to insert our own personal prayer (that which is most pressing on our hearts) along with the needful prayers of the whole church. This gathering up of prayers is actually called the COLLECT. The priest, hands extended, is lifting up all these collected prayers to God our Father. Watch for this moment, participate in this prayer pause, and know that your prayer will be among those collected by our priest and offered up to our Father in Heaven. The Collect also reflects a brief summary of the season or theme of the liturgy which we have entered into and which we can now consider as we move into the next moments of the Mass. Next week we will begin to take a closer look at the Mass Moments of the Liturgy of the Word, God's conversation with us in scripture.


#### TRANSFIGURATION MINISTRY OF PRAYER

## **Veterans Exiting Homelessness:** Move-In Essentials

We've all heard the stories. We've all seen the pictures of the homeless veterans struggling to regain their footing when returning to civilian life. They risked their lives for us. They could use a hand.....we can be "church" to them. The good news is that the Veteran's Administration (VA) has a wonderful rent subsidy program that moves the homeless veterans to apartments - with a success rate of over 60% by the 2 1/2 year mark! But there's one missing component, and that is paying for the initial & ongoing household goods that make an apartment a home, and makes that home the basis to change a life. In conjunction with a national veteran's organization (Military Outreach USA), the parishioners of Transfiguration can make a difference. On the weekend of November 9 & 10, we will be collecting the household items listed below. The VA will distribute 100% of the items collected to service veterans in the greater Chicagoland area by the following week's end. Please help us fill the collection baskets.

Personal Hygiene: bath soap, shaving cream, deodorant, combs, hair brush, nail clipper, toothpaste, toothbrush, sunscreen, Chapstick Kitchen & Cleaning: trash can, Windex, Pine Sol, dishwashing liquid, dishcloth, sponge, mop, bucket, broom, dustpan, paper towels

Bathroom: toilet paper, wash cloth, plunger, toilet bowl cleaner, toilet brush, bath towels, shower curtain

Miscellaneous: smoke detector battery, flashlight with batteries, wall calendar, appointment book, garbage bags, laundry basket, hamper, laundry detergent, aluminum foil, diapers, light bulbs

These Move-In Essentials provide a Veteran exiting homelessness with the basics needed as they transition to their new, permanent residence.

#### The Facts

- Chronic homelessness = homeless one year or more + a physical or mental disability
- that prevents someone from regaining and sustaining housing on their own.

  Our solution is "Housing First". It is permanent housing paired with supportive services (mental health, finance management, transportation, community inclusion...) that help
- ensure long-term success.
  On average 85% of Housing First tenants do not return to homelessness
- Housing First dramatically lowers taxpayer costs by reducing people's reliance on expensive services like emergency rooms, shelters, and jails/prisons.

- Our private funding campaign started in 2015. At that time there were over **120** people experiencing chronic homelessness in Lake County.
- Remarkably, federal, private and other agency funding has housed, or is expected to house, all but SIX of these individuals. In 2019, Lake County became the 10<sup>th</sup> US county to reach "functional zero" veteran
- homelessness!
- If we can house these SIX individuals, we will also end chronic homelessness. Only four U.S. communities (Lancaster County, PA – Rockford, IL – Bergen County, NJ Southwest Minnesota Continuum of Care) have done this so far!

- Our funding effort is called "Ten To End"

  You can participate by committing \$10 per month for three years.

  If 540 people make this commitment between October 10 and November 10, 2019, Lake County will have the ability to end chronic homelessness.

#### One of Lake County's many Housing First Success Stories

When A.D.'s father passed away, he moved in with his mother to provide some financial support. Shortly after, she was able to move to Minnesota where she had more family support, but A.D. struggled to find work in a new area and eventually ended up homeless. When he received housing, he said "It felt like I was in heaven. My heart felt full when I got my key and walked in my apartment. It's crazy to think that yesterday my bed was the street.


