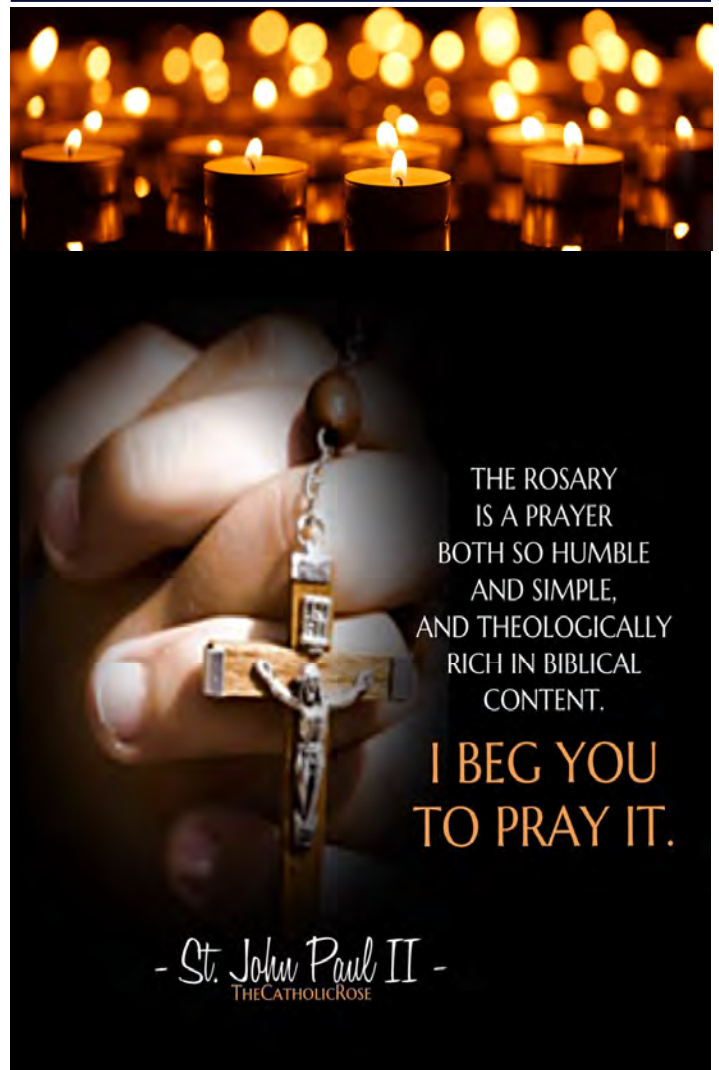

LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I — HAB 1:2-3; 2:2-4

How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, "Violence!" but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and clamorous discord. Then the LORD answered me and said: Write down the vision clearly upon the tablets, so that one can read it readily. GOSPEL — LK 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. "Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'"

## **FAITH IS A GIFT, AND GOD IS THE SOURCE AND GIVER OF THAT GIFT.**

As we read this Gospel passage, it is hard not to conclude that this request for an increase in faith comes somehow out of the blue. So what prompted the disciples to make this unusual request? To understand that we need to go back to previous passages in Luke's Gospel – the parables about the prodigal son, the dishonest steward, Lazarus and the rich man. Together, they point to a reality that God's ways are different from our ways. They remind us that if we are to be faithful disciples, then we must take our cue not from the world, but from Christ who reveals to us the very mind of God.

We use the word "faith" in different ways – from our denominational identity to our creedal statements. But when Luke speaks here of faith, and indeed when Paul speaks about the gift given through the laying on of hands, they are not simply speaking about creedal statements or identity. Instead, they refer to that gift from God that binds us and empowers us to follow and live in Christ. This is what the disciples sought: an increase in that most precious of all gifts – a strong and enduring relationship with Christ.

It has never been easy to be a Christian. The early Christians had to deal with all sorts of threats and persecutions. So we can understand why this call to faith is at the heart of the Gospels. By asking Jesus for an increase, the disciples are recognizing that he is the source of this supernatural faith, and that such a faith is not the outcome of human strength or willpower but is sheer gift from God. Because it is a gift, it can never be seen as something we can boast of as our own achievement. We are servants of the Word, and when we respond to it we are simply doing our duty.

We also live in a world where it can be difficult to be faithful disciples. In such a world, our living, acting faith is of more and more importance. To be a faith-filled Christian is not simply about having an inner conviction, but the courage and strength to live that faith on a daily basis.

Christ's word to us today is a word of encouragement that we need only a little trust – the size of the mustard seed – in his strength to carry us through in this life. It is the power of God living in and through us that will ultimately empower us to be faith-filled and faithful.

### **HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

#### **First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4**

Can you relate to this reading from the Book of Habakkuk? The writer could no longer endure violence, abuse and oppression in the world. What about you? Where do the challenges of discipleship arise for you?

Habakkuk speaks of misery and violence. What helps you survive misery in your life? In a tough situation can faith sustain you? Do you need to exercise your faith in lesser matters in order to be ready?

#### **Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14**

What did Paul say God gave us instead of the "spirit of cowardice?" How can we "stir into flames" the power of love and self-control? Can love overcome cowardice and be a weapon for Christians?

Discuss authoritarianism, empathy and openness. Which are signs of strength? And which of weakness? What about love or cowardice?

#### **Gospel: Luke 17:5-10**

Is quantity an issue when it comes to faith? Would an infinitely small amount of faith (a mustard seed's worth) fulfill what Jesus promised to the apostles?

Do you know people, as Pope Francis suggests below, who, with "incredibly strong faith," have moved mountains? Or as this Gospel asserts, have uprooted mulberry trees? Who are they? What have they accomplished? Can your faith help you do the kinds of things they did? Can it help you overcome obstacles?

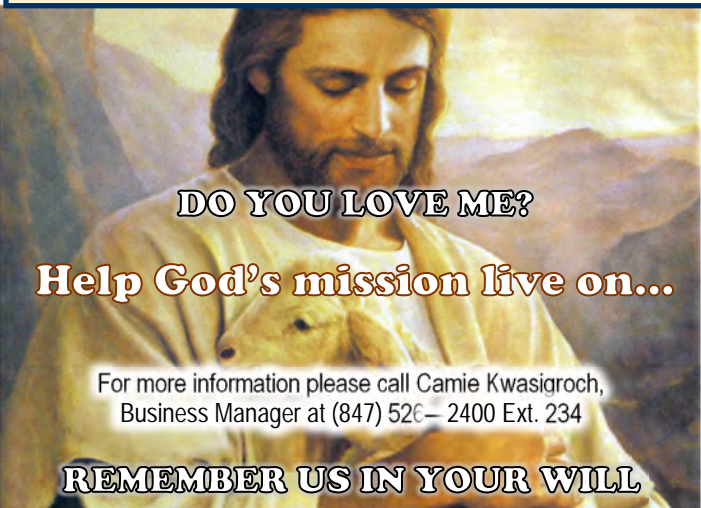

## A LITTLE IS A LOT

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus says that if you have faith even as big as a mustard seed, you could command trees and they would obey you. A mustard seed is very small. But none of us can get trees to obey our commands. And so, from this, it is clear that the faith any of us has is not even a very small amount.

It doesn't take even as much faith as a mustard seed for us to live. That's not the only disheartening thought in the Gospel Reading. It gets worse. No matter how much faith you have, as the Gospel Reading makes plain, you are still highly unsatisfactory. Jesus says that, however hard you work in the service of the Lord, at the end of the day, recognizing all your sins in the day, you should say to yourself, I am an unprofitable servant of the Lord's.

This isn't a good thought to have before going to bed, is it? And it does make it hard to get out of bed in the morning, too. Who wants to wake up with this thought: "Oh boy, another day for me to be my sinful self! At the end of this day, I will be inadequate, unsatisfactory, and unprofitable!"

You can see why the prophet in the First Reading would say to the Lord, "How long, O Lord!" The prophet thinks it is hard to wait for the Lord to do something about the sins of other people. But it can be hard to wait for the Lord to take care of our own sins too. How long indeed!

But the First Reading also says that the just will live by faith. Now real living is joyous, not depressive. And here's another thing to see. The First Reading doesn't mention how much faith you need in order to live. So, apparently, any amount is enough. Your faith doesn't have to be even mustard seed size. You will still live, really live, as long as you have any faith at all.

And so we can wait for the Lord to do something about our sins. It doesn't take even as much faith as a mustard seed for us to live. And if we live in the Lord, then we can also rejoice in the Lord, even if we are also still unprofitable servants.

And if it brings a life of joy in the Lord, then however little our faith is, it is a lot, isn't it? And that is itself a joyful thought.

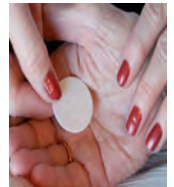

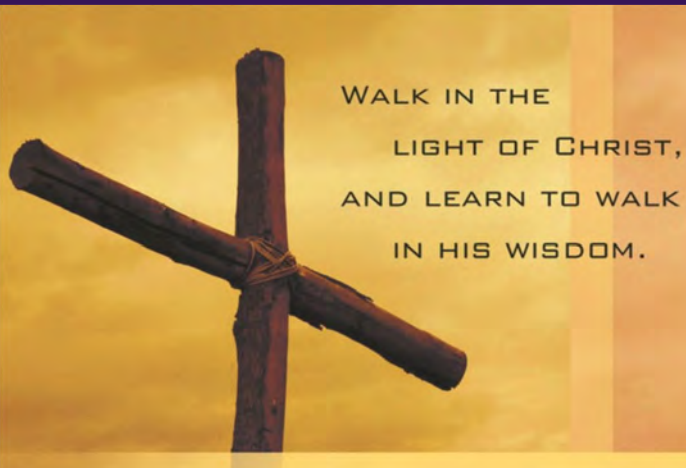

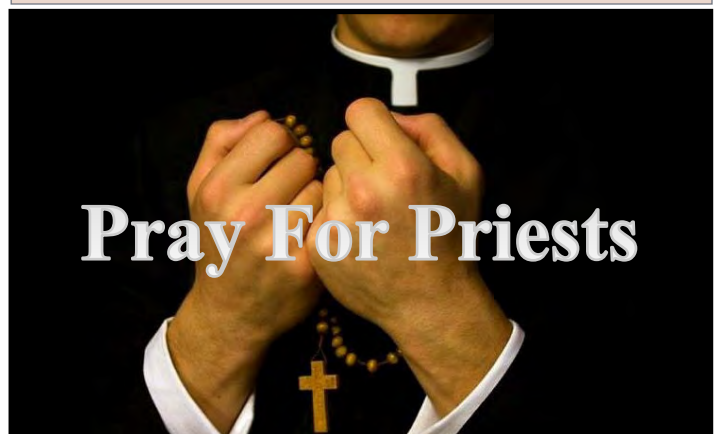
