LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I — 2 KGS 5:14-17

Naaman went down and plunged into the Jordan seven times at the word of Elisha, the man of God. His flesh became again like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy. Naaman returned with his whole retinue to the man of God. On his arrival he stood before Elisha and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant." Elisha replied, "As the LORD lives whom I serve, I will not take it;" and despite Naaman's urging, he still refused. Naaman said: "If you will not accept, please let me, your servant, have two mule-loads of earth, for I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the LORD."

READING II — 2 TM 2:8-13

As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

THROUGH OUR BAPTISM, WE HAVE BEEN CLOTHED IN CHRIST.

Our readings today illustrate how God has always had a plan for his chosen people. In the first reading, Saint Paul reminds the people of Galatia (which was part of what is now Turkey) that before Christ, people were under the Old Testament law. That means they had to follow exactly what the law of Moses proclaimed in order to find favor with God. But with Christ's birth, passion and resurrection, we have been given the choice to follow God's way, by grace through our faith in Jesus. Through our baptism, we have been *clothed* in Christ. We have become one in Jesus, and free to follow his will as well as his example.

Our short Gospel reading is from Luke. We are transported back to Jesus' time on earth when he was teaching and ministering to those in need. The crowd was amazed after witnessing him casting out demons. One woman joyfully declared, *Blessed is the womb that carried you*. Jesus does not deny that our Mother Mary is blessed, but informs the woman, as well as the crowd, that those who hear the word of God and keep it also are blessed. He's referring to all believers from his time on earth as well as through the centuries of Christian faith. And that includes us here today.

We are part of God's family, just like the Israelites were, and just like his disciples and followers were

when Jesus walked on this earth. And according to our Gospel reading, we, too, are blessed if we hear God's word and follow it. So, the charge for each one of us here today is this: we are hearing God's word right now and he wants us to participate in his salvation for the world.

The choice, then, lies within our power. Should we choose to embrace all that Jesus teaches, we will be blessed. That is God's promise. And we do have that choice. Through faith, we are the children of God. Today, let us encourage each other to follow Jesus even more closely and faithfully than we did yesterday. The blessings are more powerful than we can ever fully understand.

HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Have you ever brought sand, shells, rocks, anything else from foreign places back to your home? What does Naaman's taking holy ground back to Syria say to you? Where is your holy ground?

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

What saints would you say have suffered for the gospel? Who suffers for the gospel today? Do you? in what ways? Paul says, "I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus." How would this work? Is Paul saying that your suffering is linked to the salvation of others? Has your faith been affected by the cloud of witnesses who surround you and those who have gone before you?

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19

This Sunday we see foreigners who were grateful: the Syrian blind man, and in the First Reading the foreigner, Naaman. Does God offer generous love regardless of a person's origins or accomplishments? Do you give of yourself or your goods when there is ingratitude? Do you take note when God pours grace into your life? Are you grateful? what is a most important message Jesus gives us in his healing of the ten lepers? Is there any little thing that you can do to heal someone else's wounds?

Our People

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus cleanses ten lepers, but only one of them turns back to thank Jesus. That one is a Samaritan.

Samaritans aren't really part of God's people. They were separated from God's people earlier in their history.

By loving the Samaritan leper and the Greek woman, the Lord found his own people everywhere. In a different gospel reading (Matt.15:24; see also Mark 7:27), Jesus tells a Greek woman in Sidon, who persists in her requests for him to heal her daughter, that he was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel. Greeks are not part of God's people either; they are even more outsiders than Samaritans are.

But here is an odd thing to notice: Jesus does after all heal the daughter of the Greek woman. He cured the Samaritan leper too.

So was Jesus confused when he said he was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel? Or, if his job really is to minister only to his own people, then why did he give such powerful gifts of healing, such tender care, to the Samaritan leper and to the Greek woman? After all, they aren't part of his people. And he said he was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel.

The solution to this puzzle lies in the First Reading. Namaan, the leper who comes to Elisha, the Israelite prophet, to be healed, is a Syrian. Not only are Syrians not part of God's people; they are in fact among the enemies of God's people. They worship an alien God. But Elisha heals Namaan anyway.

And then look what happens. Namaan the leper asks if Elisha will give him some dirt to build an altar to Elisha's God. When Elisha healed him, Namaan became committed to the true God. He wants dirt from Israel for an altar so that he can worship the God of Israel when he goes home to Syria. So Namaan comes to Elisha as a Syrian, but he leaves Elisha as a worshiper of the Lord.

A similar point holds of the Samaritan leper, and even of the woman in Sidon. They each become one of Jesus' own, because of Jesus' care for them. Your faith has saved you, Jesus says to the Samaritan when he returns to Jesus. To the Greek woman in Sidon who won't leave him, Jesus says, "Great is your faith!" (Mt 15:28)

In doing a miracle for the Greek woman in Sidon, then, Jesus was in fact caring only for the lost sheep of Israel. By loving the Samaritan leper and the Greek woman, the Lord found his own people everywhere.

The lesson for us is clear, isn't it? Treat him with gentleness and care, and the person in front of you, hostile to all you hold dear, may in the end turn out to be one of the Lord's own people.

Kyrie Eleison Asking God's blessing of healing love

In faith and confidence that God will have mercy if we ask -- and God wants us to ask – we now turn our attention to acknowledging God's merciful love. Sometimes sung, sometimes spoken, the Deacon, if present, or the priest, leads us in a 3-part litany or petition prayer. Kyrie Eleison, Lord have mercy, Christe Eleison, Christ have mercy, Kyrie Eleison, Lord have mercy. It is a plea yet it is a moment of trust and awe. With each line, in trust, we are petitioning God for his blessing and, with each repetition, in awe, remembering the ways God has already showered merciful, healing love upon us.

Do you know that the words 'Kyrie Eleison' are Greek? Greek was the original language of the New Testament and also of the origins of our sacred liturgy, in Rome. Many scholars believe this little, beautiful snippet of the Greek language, preserved no matter what language the rest of the Mass is prayed, serves to connect us today with the beginning of our faith tradition in the Mass.

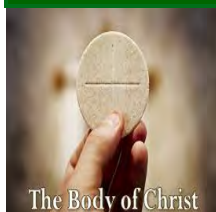

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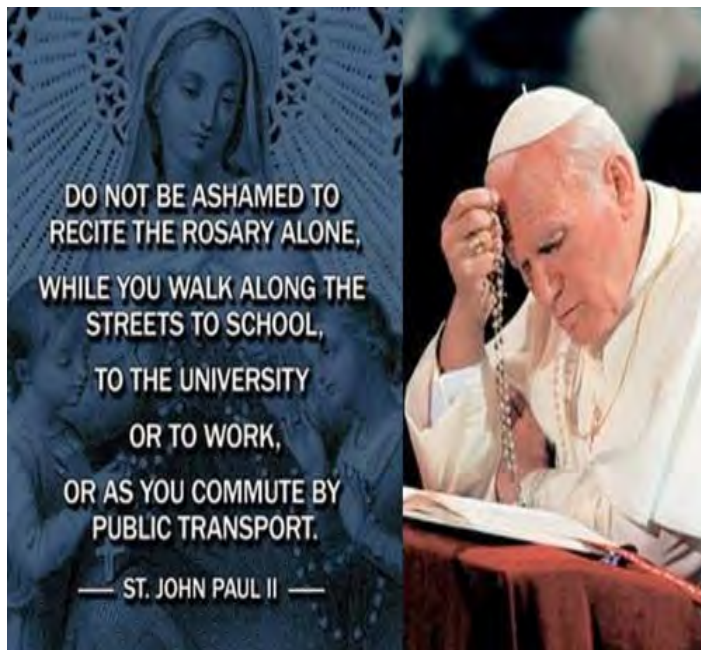

RCIA is also for adults who have been baptized but have not completed their sacraments of initiation.

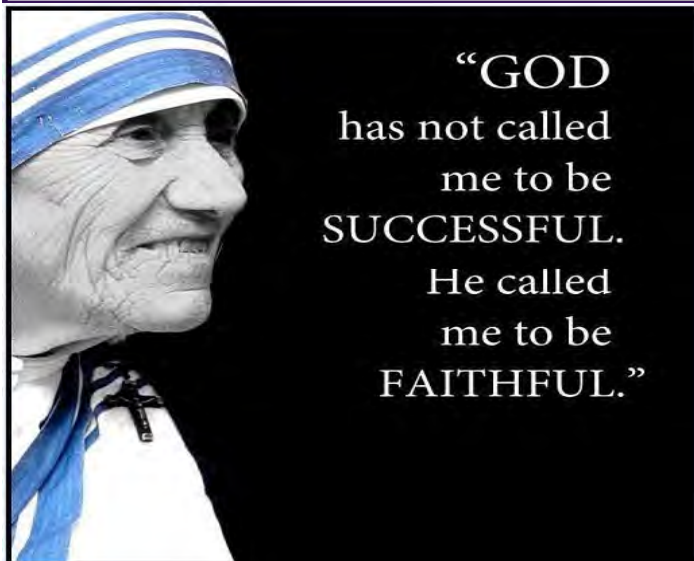
RCIA is for anyone who would like to learn more about their Catholic faith.

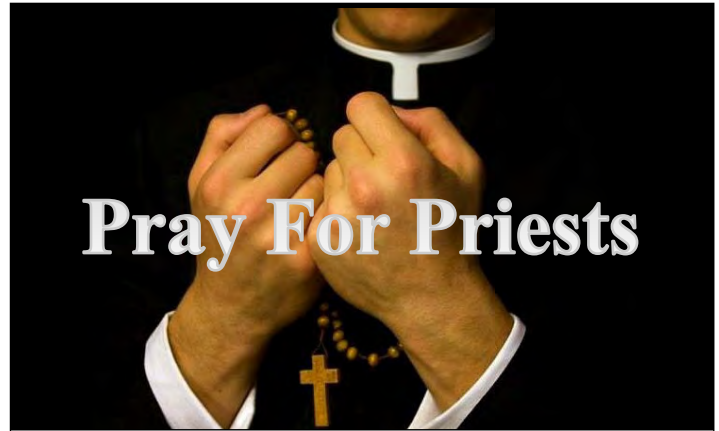

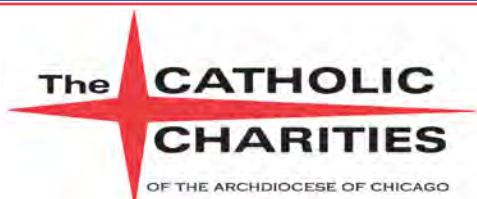
