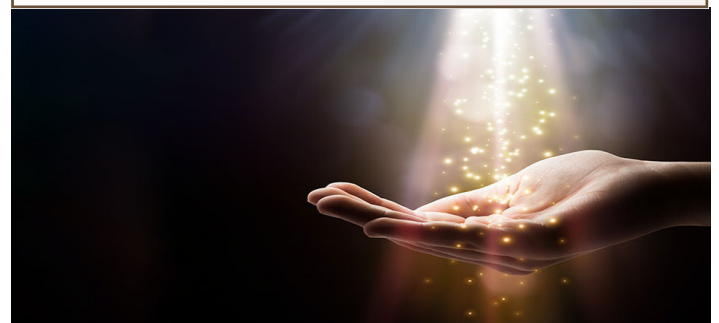

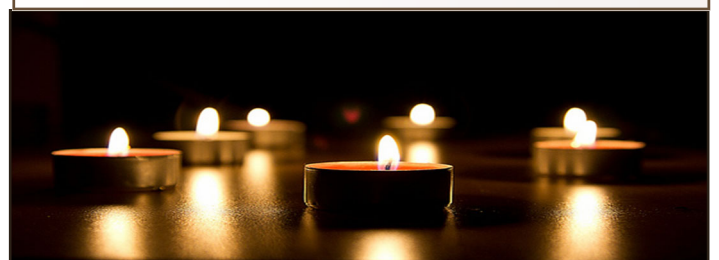

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING I — SIR 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins—a house raised in justice to you.

Psalm 128 : Blest are those who Love you # 70

READING II — COL 3:12-21

Brothers and sisters: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Wives, be subordinate to your husbands, as is proper in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and avoid any bitterness toward them. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. Fathers, do not provoke your children, so they may not become discouraged.

GOSPEL — MT 2:13-15, 19-23

When the magi had departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod, that what the Lord had said through the prophet might be fulfilled, *Out of Egypt I called my son*. When Herod had died, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." He rose, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go back there. And because he had been warned in a dream, he departed for the region of Galilee. He went and dwelt in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, *He shall be called a Nazorean*.

DO EVERYTHING IN THE NAME OF JESUS.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The readings call us to attitudes and actions that can bring harmony and joy to our family life. Sirach, echoing the lesson of the Fourth Commandment, emphasizes our call to obey, honor, respect and even revere our parents. He notes the many blessings that this reverent and respectful attitude can bring us.

In a sense, when we honor our parents, we also honor our God, who worked through those parents to bring us life. The catechism reminds us that respect and honor to parents “derives from gratitude toward those who, by the gift of life, their love and their work, have brought their children into the world and enabled them to grow in stature, wisdom, and grace” (CCC 2215). This gratitude to our parents and to God can lead us to deeper appreciation of the gifts we have received through the basic gift of life.

Paul, in his Letter to the Colossians, gives us tools to bring healing to our family relationships. As God’s children, *holy and beloved*, we are called to put on *heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience*, and to top these qualities off with forgiveness and the bond of love. Perhaps most important, Paul reminds us as Christian families to put Jesus at the very center of our family life: to be controlled by the peace of Christ, to let Jesus’ word dwell within us, and to do everything in the name of Jesus.

HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

First Reading: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

Is the honoring of parents the same as gratitude towards God?

Why do you think Sirach says that good things happen to you when you honor your parents?

Second Reading: Colossians 3:12-21

“Over all these put on love.” What is the only thing God asks of us? What happens to people when they are loved? What kinds of things would disappear off the face of the earth because they wouldn’t be necessary if everyone loved his/her neighbor?

In his letter to the Colossians St. Paul gives some ideas about how we can love each other and live in harmony. Have compassion, kindness, humility, patience, bearing with one another, and forgiving each other—is this easy? How you doing with Paul’s assignment as Church? How are you doing with it in your life?

Gospel: Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

Does Joseph have second thoughts about leaving his job, dwelling, or possessions when the angel tells him to take Mary and flee to Egypt? What was the only thing that was important to the holy family? How far will you step out of your comfort zone for other people? Name some ways you can insure the safety or well being of your brothers and sisters in Christ.

Why would a savior arrive as a baby, when he could have come as a king?

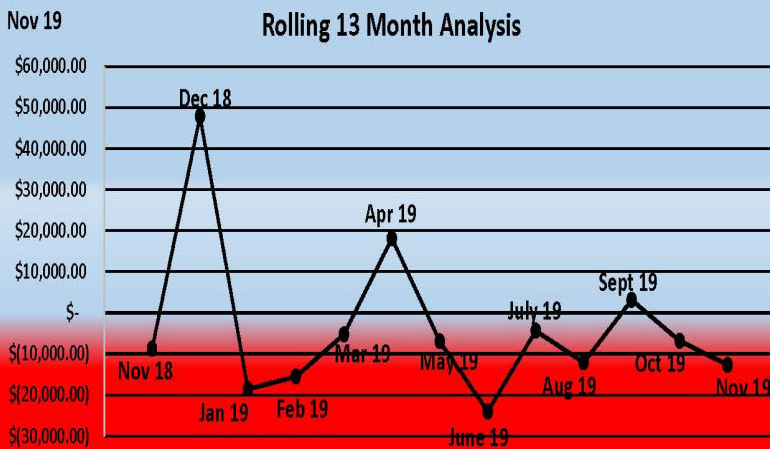

New Year's Prayer

January 1

God, thank you for a new year. May everyone in our family be willing to begin anew with a clean slate. We know that you are always ready to forgive us. Help us to be willing to forgive ourselves and to forgive one another.

As we begin a new year, remind us of our truest values and our deepest desires. Help us to live in the goodness that comes from doing what you want us to do. Help us to put aside anxiety about the future and the past, so that we might live in peace with you now, one day at a time.

WEeping FOR THE CHILDREN

The angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and told him to flee, because Herod was looking for the young child to destroy him. And so Joseph fled and the young child—Jesus, the Lord—was saved.

Herod, who couldn't find the particular young child he was looking for, hedged his bets by killing every young child in Bethlehem (Mt 2:16). Another part of the Gospel (Mt. 2:17-18) quotes Jeremiah to explain how bad it was then in Bethlehem: Rachel weeping for her children and would not be comforted because they were not.

Because Jesus lived to die, there is a consolation even for inconsolable tears. Why didn't God send his angel to warn all the fathers of young children in Bethlehem? What happened to the heartfelt compassion and gentleness that Paul recommends in the Second Reading? Doesn't God have gentleness for all young children? Doesn't God have compassion for all parents of young children? Isn't God perfect love? Why did he let all these children die?

But here is another question: why did God take care to make sure that the young child Jesus would live? Here is the answer: because Jesus came to die for all people, young children, adults, old people. Jesus came to die as an adult, on the cross. And so he couldn't die as a young child.

Because he came to die, because he suffered and died on the cross, there is real life, unending life, for everyone who dies, at any age.

There is something worth inconsolable tears in the death of every human being, and especially in the death of children, so innocent, so lovely. And yet because Jesus lived to die, there is a consolation even for inconsolable tears.

In Jeremiah, the lines about Rachel weeping for her children are not the end of the passage. It finishes this way: thus says the Lord, don't cry, don't cry! Your children will come again! They will come again, in the end, to their own home. (Jer 31:16)

OUR FIRST PRIORITY

We can be critical of the old family structure reflected in the command for wives to be submissive to their husbands, but we must admit that the old structure worked in many ways. Families were stable social units, contributing much to the right ordering of society.

We no longer feel comfortable with wives being submissive to husbands, and just the reading of this passage in today's liturgy offends some people. Perhaps we ought to accept this reading as a challenge to find a new family structure that works.

The alternative to the old family structure should not be an absence of structure resulting in the breakdown of the family; rather, it should be a new family structure built around mutual love and equal partnership.

The celebration of the Holy Family should serve as a reminder to us that the family is holy; that there is a reflection of our Trinitarian God in the father, mother and child of the family; and that there will be no order in society if there is not stability in family life.

As a nation, we need to make children and families our first priority, to invest in their future; to combat the forces—cultural, economic and moral—which hurt children and destroy families; to manage our economy, shape our government, and direct our institutions to support and not undermine our families. 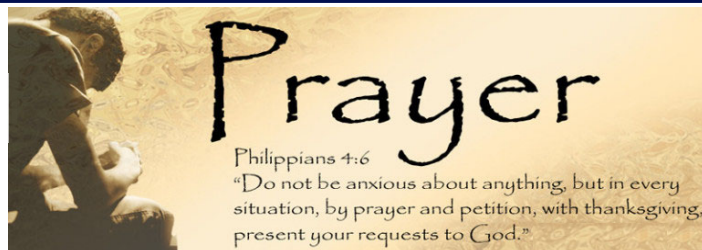


Ministers of Care
