





#### Pastor's Column



The theme of the 2020 Annual Catholic Appeal is

## "COME FOLLOW ME... AND HEAL OUR WORLD."

Last week, we began a special cycle of readings from Matthew's Gospel drawn from the Sermon on the Mount. Those Gospel readings are special, because they represent the charter for the Kingdom of God and for the disciples who belong to that Kingdom. The words of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount give us both a sense of our identity as disciples and our mission to foster the coming of the Kingdom of God. We come to know who we are and what our purpose is.

In John's Gospel, Jesus says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (John 8:12) In today's Gospel, Jesus says to his disciples in a way that perhaps ought to startle us, "You are the light of the world...(and) your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." The disciples who follow the Master, the light of the world, are themselves His radiance in this world. That is indeed striking.

Still, we might ask ourselves, "How exactly are we light in the world? What does this mean? How is it shaped?" There are clues in the Gospel itself. Somehow, there is a connection between being a light and doing good deeds. Jesus says, "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds..." The prophet Isaiah spells it out in greater detail: "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed..."

When we, the disciples of Jesus, bring a healing presence to our wounded and broken world and humanity, we reflect the very light of Christ and share him with others. Our proclamation of Jesus, our presentation of him to a world in need, is not only a matter of words. Saint Paul seems to be aware of this, as we heard in the second reading from his letter to the Corinthians: "When I came to you, brothers and sisters, proclaiming the mystery of God, I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom." In our deeds, especially in our work for the healing of others and the world, we bring and share the light of Christ.

Next weekend is commitment Sunday for the Annual Catholic Appeal of the Archdiocese of Chicago. And we will have an opportunity to extend our healing mission through the ministry of the Church. The theme for this year's appeal is "Come follow me... and heal our world." Our financial support, our prayerful support, and our direct involvement in the Church's outreach in parishes, education, religious and ministerial formation, initiatives for justice, peace, and respect for life – all these bring healing and light into our world.

Across this next week, **reflect**, **pray**, **and** ask yourself questions about the meaning of following Jesus and how, in a very specific way, you can carry his healing into the world. Consider what you might contribute from your time, talent, and treasure to make a healing difference. In this way, you will answer His call to follow Him, to bring His healing, and to be His light in our world.

The Eucharist we are now celebrating summons us once again to follow Jesus. His death and resurrection celebrated here are the source both of our own healing and our empowerment to carry forward healing for others.

#### Why Have a Second Collection?

#### A Stewardship Moment


"Discipleship means that we care about one another. Discipleship means that the needs of the Church touch our hearts and inspire us to tend to the needs of others—whether those impacted by local floods and hurricanes that destroy the lives of people in our own nation or in lands that we have only just read about. It seems that all we require is a reminder of the need, and we open our lives in concern for other. It is a tradition that Paul began for the ancient Church, and we have been having 'second collections' since then—with no end in sight, as long as there is a need that we find!" – Archbishop Wilton Gregory

Second collections are a stewardship learning moment. As Catholics we are part of a universal Church that extends well beyond our own parish boundaries. Jesus calls us to "make disciples of all nations" (Mt. 28:19). Through the second collection, we have a ready opportunity to give to those causes held up by our Church leaders as important in fulfilling that call of Our Lord.

Second collections develop international awareness of the needs of those beneficiaries—whether an Indian child on a North Dakota reservation or a pilgrim to the Holy Land. The bishops in the United States created the national collections so that by combining our resources we can more effectively carry out our mission as Catholics. Each of the collections is worthy of support and represents our community of faith at its best—working in the world, improving lives, and saving souls.

#### **Donor Rights**

We take our donors' intentions seriously. Transfiguration Parish has adopted a "Donor Bill of Rights." to assure you that the gifts you give, whether at the parish level or the archdiocesan level, will be used for the purposes for which they were given. For example, when a second collection is held for the Catholic Relief Fund, donors can be confident that their financial gift is being forwarded to Catholic Relief Services. If for some reason, a donor does not wish to support an organization designated for the second collection, they need only withhold their second collection gift on that particular Sunday.



## Taking a closer look at... the Memorial Acclamation in the Anamnesis

What is the "mystery of faith" in the Eucharistic Prayer? The formal name for this moment in the Mass is the Anamnesis. It is a statement by which the Church, fulfilling the command that she received from Christ the Lord, through the Apostles, celebrates the memorial of Christ, recalling his Passion, Resurrection, and Ascension into heaven. The Roman missal instructs that after the consecration, the priest, alone, makes the statement 'THE MYSTERY OF FAITH'. The people then respond with an acclamation or statement of support. Why is this? To fully appreciate this moment, we've got to understand that the original meaning of the word MYSTERY, is rooted in a tiny ancient word, MUO. This word literally means to 'shut the mouth'. Muo is the root word from which we get the English word MUTE. So, the word MYSTERY refers to being rendered 'silent' or 'dumbfounded' by the magnificence of what has been revealed. Consider this: The consecration of the bread and wine has just happened. The priest comes up from a genuflection and recognizes that right before him, on the altar, is the body and blood of Jesus Christ. He states 'the mystery of faith' and is so amazed by the mystery before him that he becomes silent. The people then come to his aid and finish, with one of three acclamations, the fullness of the mystery that has just been recalled. We sing "We proclaim" your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection, until you come again." OR "When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again." OR "Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free." This Mass moment is a marvelous combination of priest and people working together, in celebration of the great gift and mystery of the Eucharist.

Next week we will look at Part 2 of the Eucharistic Prayer as we continue toward our ultimate encounter with Jesus.
