BE HOLY, FOR I THE LORD, YOUR GOD, AM HOLY.

The word *holy* means “to set apart; to be consecrated to God; to be dedicated to a sacred purpose.” If asked, each one of us could probably name someone whom we think is “holy.” Perhaps it is a deceased person whose life was so exemplary that the Church has declared them a saint – Mother Teresa, or a courageous martyr, Saint Joseph, the Blessed Mother, or our patron saint. It may even be a living person whom we admire – a person who has shown great faith during times of trial. We tend to know a holy person when we see him, or her.

How did Jesus talk about holiness? These are some of the things he told his disciples in today’s Gospel: *When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well*; Love your neighbor *and* your enemies; *pray for those who persecute you*, should anyone want you to go one mile, go two miles instead.

It is a bit of a mix of things to do, and things to not do. In the end, he sort of summarizes all of this by telling his disciples *to be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect*. Jesus lived in full communion with God, and he expected his disciples to do the same. Indeed, he asks *us* to do the same. It is our universal vocation: *All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity. All are called to holiness (CCC 2013)*.

What he asks of us is not impossible, for God commands what we are capable of doing (Cf., Deut 30:11). Granted, we cannot do it without his help, but there is nothing set before us that we cannot achieve with his grace (Cf. Mt 11:30, 1 John 5:3). And in the matter of holiness – which is always a process – we have the Holy Spirit to guide us. Paul writes to the Corinthians, *Do you not know that you*

are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? Each one of us, by our very baptism, is sanctified [made holy] by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. We are temples of God, belonging to Christ, and in whom Christ dwells.

As we prepare to receive Christ into our bodies, transforming us for the sake of ourselves and the world, may we embrace this call to holiness with our whole heart. For we are indeed temples in whom the Holy One dwells, and we are sanctified in this life so as to be perfect in the next.

HEART OF THE MATTER: TIME FOR REFLECTION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

1. “Be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am holy.” Does the Lord tell us what holiness is? What does this reading prescribe for us to be holy? Is holiness related to how we interact with others?

2. If we all “loved our neighbors as ourselves” do you think there would be wars, prisons, hunger and poverty? One way the Lord says to love your neighbor is “you shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart. ... Cherish no grudge against any of your people.” Is this an easy thing to do? Have you tried it? Will you try again?

3. Why would Jesus tell you to “Love your enemies?” Who loves like that? Did Jesus show us a new revolutionary kind of acting when he showed us how to love our enemies? How far was he willing to go for them with his radical self-emptying? How far was the Father willing to go for his children?





MASS MOMENTS

Taking a closer look at... the Lord's Prayer, in the Communion Rite of the Liturgy of the Eucharist

In our Mass Moment series, we now enter the Communion Rite which leads all the faithful to the table of the Eucharist. The Communion Rite begins when we stand and join our voices to pray for the coming of God's kingdom -- to ask God to provide for our needs, forgive our sins, and bring us to the joy of heaven. All this takes place in today's Mass moment: the Lord's Prayer -- the Our Father. In the Gospels of Matthew and Luke – it is the prayer that Jesus taught to his disciples when they asked him how they should pray. In his talk on the Mass, Bishop Barron shares how beautiful it is that we don't pray [the Lord's Prayer] until Jesus is really, truly and substantially present in our midst. We wait for that moment to pray his words and to claim as our father, his father. In the Lord's prayer we pray for God's kingdom of heaven to be present on earth -- and if we listen closely – God does just that as he also provides us with the daily bread we ask to receive. Remember for a moment, the children of Israel on their journey in the desert. We know they received manna from God – that substance beyond the ordinary for their daily bread -- that which they needed to live in order to enter the promised land. The original Greek meaning behind the term "our daily bread" translates as 'super-substantial' bread. The eucharistic bread now present for us in the Mass, is the 'super substantial bread' provided by the Father through the Holy Spirit. Jesus, then, taught us to pray for the Eucharist – our manna from heaven -- our daily bread – which is ultimately the reconciliation of heaven and earth in new life – the sustenance we need, making God's kingdom more present to us, every time we receive it. Our father who art in heaven – holy be thy name!

Next week we will explore the Sign of Peace within the Communion Rite.
