

As of March 2, 2020

The Archdiocese of Chicago is closely monitoring the news regarding Coronavirus/COVID-19 and actively planning for any potential circumstances. We are adhering to all guidance provided by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Below are guidelines from the CDC for individual preventive measures and liturgical considerations, based on guidance from the USCCB Committee on Divine Worship, to be implemented in all parishes within the Archdiocese of Chicago until further notice.

Individual Preventive Actions

- Stay home when you are sick and if you have a fever, stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone.
- If you or a member of your household have traveled to any of the [Level 2+ countries](#) (per the CDC China, Iran, Italy, South Korea, Japan as of March 2, 2020) between February 10, 2020 and today, alert your direct supervisor or principal so your workplace or school may take appropriate precautions
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash immediately and not on any hard surface. If tissues are not available, cough or sneeze into

your sleeve.

- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Eliminate open sources of shared snacks and food in the workplace.
- Stop shaking hands.

Liturgical Celebrations During all Masses and liturgies:

- Refrain from physical contact during the Sign of Peace (note: the Sign of Peace can be exchanged without physical contact)
- Refrain from distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful via the chalice (please consider options for any parishioners with celiac disease or sensitivity)
- Given the frequency of direct contact with saliva in the distribution of Holy Communion on the tongue, every consideration should be given by each individual to receive Holy Communion reverently in open hands for the time being.
- Refrain from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer.
- Refrain from using Holy Water fonts.

Assure faithful if you are sick or are experiencing symptoms of sickness, you are not obliged to attend Mass, and even that out of charity you ought not to attend.

- Catechism 2181 allows for serious reasons like illness. For a faithful to miss mass.

Taking a closer look at... the Breaking of the Bread as we sing the Lamb of God

After sharing the Sign of Peace, we continue the Communion Rite in the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the moment of the BREAKING OF THE BREAD during the Agnus Dei, Latin for Lamb of God. The scriptural background of this Mass Moment begins in the Old Testament book of Isaiah, chapter 53, where a coming savior is compared to a Lamb; and then in the new testament book of John 1:29, when John the Baptist, upon seeing Jesus, said "Behold the Lamb of God"; and adding purpose says "who takes away the sins of the world". Notice he said 'the WORLD' and not just one person or one nation. While both priest and people, with reverence and awe, make a plea and sing "*Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us*", a significant action is taking place upon the altar. While together we repeat the plea, "*Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us*", the priest breaks the bread, the host – the body of Christ -- putting a tiny piece of it in the cup of the blood of Christ as a sign of unity. Together we sing a final plea, "*Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.*" We need and have just asked for the peace of Christ to reconcile us with His saving action. In the earliest days of the Church, it was this moment that gave the entire celebration we now call the Mass its name: The Breaking of the Bread. It is in this moment "we profess that the real presence of Christ in the sacramental bread and the sacramental wine is available to us only when the host is broken for us."^{*}

Next week we will look at the moment of Communion with Jesus and each other.
