COMMUNITY: Friends in Faith

Scripture: Mark 9:2-8

What does God want us to know? We need the support of others to persevere in our faith. We need a few people that really know us. Small groups are that community and the pathway to true authenticity.

What does God want us to do? Identify and connect with a few individuals to develop deeper relationships for genuine sharing.

What does God want us to feel? Encouragement and a sense of belonging within a supportive community.

Grit and perseverance do not come from sheer will power. We need a community of people who will journey and pray for us. Jesus modeled this with the disciples. He built a community of 12 apostles and then brought in Peter, James and John who had special access to them. **To persevere in your faith and other areas of life you need both a community of people that know and support you and then three people who really know you.**

#LIVINGLENT?

I Persevere: COMMUNITY: Friends in Faith.

This is the second week of our series about the importance of perseverance in our faith, in our relationship with Christ and his Church. In this season our faith is being tested. Your faith in Christ is being tested. I know mine is. We might not like that, but testing is actually a sign of God's love for us. Our faith grows in the same way a muscle grows – through testing and trials. He tests you because without tests and trials you will not mature in faith, you will not go deeper in your relationship with him. Testing prepares you for future blessing that you will not enjoy unless you persevere in your connection to Christ and his Church. So, through the course of this series, we are looking at the how to persevere in our faith. Through this series we'll be looking at four key factors that will help us persevere in our faith: Community, Passion, Ministry and Purpose. This weekend we'll tackle the first one: Community: Friends in Faith. All of us have had an experience or experiences where we are glad, we persevered through an experience. Getting through my graduate studies was a key lesson in perseverance for me. Perhaps the biggest one of my whole life. I studied at the University of Saint Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary. Classes were taught in English, that might sound obvious for you, but back then let me tell you, that was a great deal for me as student of English as a Second language. I only have three quarters of formally learning English as a Second language but other than that I did not speak in at all. Only God knows how hard that was; classes were very intense, and I am not a scholar. To say the least from day one I was in over my head. More than once, in fact, fairly often, I considered leaving, I dreamed of quitting. Until that is, near the end of my first year, I consider going back to Mexico, but it would certainly have been an easier path but also a considerable step down. That was it, that was all I needed to double down in my determination to succeed. I gave it everything I had, I worked hard as I knew how and to this day my proudest possessions are the University of Saint Mary of the Lake degrees that hang in my study. But it was through that experience I learned one key factor that seems crucial to perseverance in our faith. To take a look at it, we're once going to look at a passage from the Gospel of Mark. It is an important moment in Jesus' life called the Transfiguration. The Transfiguration comes on the heels of another important moment. About a week earlier, Peter makes the life changing confession of faith that Jesus is the Son of God, the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus affirms Peter. He tells Peter he got it right. Then Jesus goes on to describe what must happen to him as the Messiah. And what he describes is very different from Peter's vision of the Messiah. As the Messiah Jesus will be handed over to the Roman authorities by the Jewish leaders. He will be beaten and nailed to the cross. He will suffer and die. None of this squared with their idea of the Messiah. They understood the Messiah to be a victorious political and military figure who would destroy the enemies of the Jewish people. They didn't understand the need for a suffering servant. And furthermore, they didn't understand that just as Jesus takes up a cross, they must do the same. As the cross and glory are linked in his life, so the cross and glory will be linked in the lives of Jesus' followers. Jesus is victorious. He is victorious over sin and death by his death on the cross. But the apostles did not understand that had to happen. They naturally saw the cross as an utter failure because what else could it be. Thus the Transfiguration. Jesus makes an investment in them so that they will endure in their faith. Jesus took Peter, James and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. Jesus formed a community of 12 apostles, but out of that group Peter, James and John formed an inner circle. They were the three key leaders of the early Church and Jesus had a special relationship with them. They knew him better than anyone else. In a few key instances, Jesus would allow them to see what the others were not shown. The intensity of his emotions, The effectiveness of his touch, The power of his prayer. Here in this instance, he shows another side of himself that he kept hidden from the rest of the world.

And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, Jesus allows his three close friends to see his divinity. The white clothes are a symbol of God's holiness and power. The clothing stands as a visible expression of who Jesus is and it foreshadows his resurrection from the dead. Later Peter writes about this event and uses the word: We had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. In that moment, the majesty of Jesus was shown to the apostles. They needed to see Jesus' hidden glory because they were going to see his public shame. They would see Jesus arrested and know of his public humiliation on the cross. To all appearances he would look like a failure, but here Jesus allows them to see the truth of his being. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. It is a big moment, as Jesus appears with two of the towering figures of the Old Testament alive from the dead. That's a big moment. Then the moment gets even bigger. A cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus. It is the voice of God the Father speaking. Mark does not tell us what that voice sounded like...that is left to the imagination, but his message is not. "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." In other words, Follow him even though: he is going to be arrested and dragged through the city in chains, humiliated before everyone. Follow him even though: hauled before a court of law and condemned like a common criminal. Follow him even though: beaten and bloodied, mocked and insulted and then crucified and left to die on the Cross. Listen to him: even when it looks like it is not worth it. Listen to him: even when it appears to be a losing proposition. Listen to him: even when it will cost you everything. So in this flash, this instant there is this great theophany, this intense moment of revelation where it is so clear who Jesus is – his clothes becoming dazzling white, a voice thundering from the heavens, a cloud of God's presence and then...suddenly...its gone. It's a fleeting glimpse into the glory of God and then it's gone. That's the nature of those mountain top moments. Quick peaks into a reality that is always there but remains hidden during normal everyday life. They are moments that communicate so much, and they can be so powerful. Then they are gone. We can wonder if they were real. Three of the Gospels – Matthew, Mark, and Luke describe this episode in Jesus' life. Of the three though, Mark emphasizes that the event is for the benefit of Peter, James, and John. Jesus takes "all three" up the mountain. He is transfigured "before them" Elijah and Moses appear "before them" God's voice speaks "to them." The theme is emphasized in Mark's account. This is probably because Mark learned about this event from Peter himself, who passed it on to him firsthand. Jesus arranges this event to strengthen them in their faith. The point is: to persevere in your faith, especially through trials and troubles you need friends in faith, who can stand with you, who can walk with you and remind you of God's faithfulness when life is challenging. At Transfiguration small groups are the principle way we want to connect with friends in faith. And even though we haven't been very successful in the past. I encourage you all to join a group, form your own group as we prepared for Lent. We all need friends in faith. There is actually one other aspect to my university story. At the USML, as we called it, our exams were both written and oral exams. My class was huge and the exams were given alphabetically, so the exam for the class could take a couple of days or more. I was always one of the very first people to take my exams. So, I needed to prepare even weeks for anybody else, but I have a great group of classmates that form a study group. Jin, Chema, Diego and I became friends and formed the habit of "studying" together for our exams and through the academic year. But actually, if truth be told, we weren't really studying together. I was able to persevere through that challenging experience not through sheer determination and grit, but because my closest friends walked with me through it. But the point is the immeasurable, indispensable value of friends in faith. Just like Jesus, Peter, James and John.

El ángel del Señor volvió a llamar a Abraham desde el cielo y le dijo: "Juro por mí mismo, dice el Señor, que por haber hecho esto y no haberme negado a tu hijo único, yo te bendeciré y multiplicaré tu descendencia como las estrellas del cielo y las arenas del mar. Tus descendientes conquistarán las ciudades enemigas. En tu descendencia serán bendecidos todos los pueblos de la tierra, porque obedeciste a mis palabras".

¿Qué quiere Dios que sintamos? Ánimo y sentido de pertenencia dentro de una comunidad solidaria.

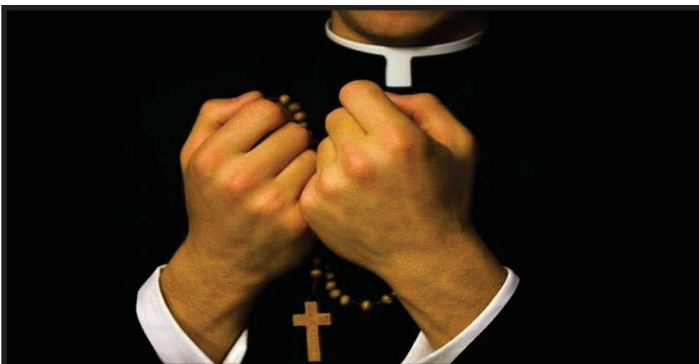

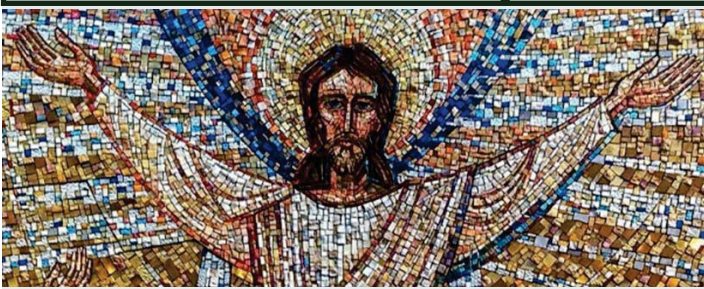

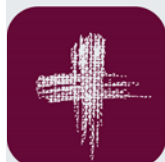
