ONE CHURCH—ONE MESSAGE: LENTEN MESSAGE SERIES

GRACE: We are God's Workmanship

Scripture: Ephesians 2:4-10

What does God want us to know? You are God's work of art. Your life is not your project. It is God's project. You will only know the work he has prepared for you to do by staying connected to him.

What does God want us to do? Embrace the idea that life is God's masterpiece; seek guidance through faith for discovering God's plans

What does God want us to feel? A sense of purpose and direction by acknowledging life as God's project.

Ephesians tells us that we are God's workmanship. We are his project and we can grow by his grace into who he has created us to be if we persevere in our relationship with him. Living out our faith and remaining committed to it means recognizing that we must persevere so that we will do the good works God has created us to do. Without living in our faith, we will not discover what God has prepared in advance for us to do.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy.

Second Reading: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ.

Gospel: For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

I Persevere: Grace/ God's Workmanship

This is the fourth week of our series about the importance of perseverance in our faith, in our relationship with Christ and his Church. So, through the course of this series, we are looking at how to persevere in our faith despite the challenge, and we'll be looking at four key factors that can help. Two weeks ago, we looked at the first one: Connections; Friends in Faith we need connections, we need support to persevere in our faith. We were never meant to try and grow and live our faith all alone and on our own. Last week, we looked at the importance of Passion/Zeal. Our savior was not this bland, vanilla person. He had zeal for his mission and message. He expressed this zeal and passion many times throughout his life. Zeal and passion are fostered by exploring new spiritual practices or habits or doing old ones in slightly new ways. This weekend we're going to look at another factor that's important when considering perseverance. St. Paul talks about this important element in his Letter to the Ephesians. Paul lived in Ephesus for three years. The investment in Ephesus was strategic, as it was the fourth largest city in the Roman Empire and the capital of the Roman province of western Asia Minor. It's location also ensured it as an important center of commerce. The city was famous for its large and beautiful temple to the goddess Artemis, an edifice considered one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. Paul wrote to the church there to help encourage them and expand the horizons of their faith, stating in an entirely matter-of-fact kind of way, You were dead in your transgressions and your sins. Maybe you don't believe in God, or maybe, you believe in God, but you don't believe in a God who actually cares about what you do. And as far as sin goes, it's your life and it's your business and no one else's... as long as it doesn't hurt anyone else... St Paul would respond, sin always hurts someone because it always hurts you, it hurts your heart. And over time it can have a dead ending effect. We can even become less and less of our true selves, our best selves. And God very much cares about that. At the same time sin, transgressions, wrongdoing are all part of the human condition. And Paul reminds us that we all have sinned. Therefore what? Should we just feel bad about ourselves Paul quickly places the sadness of sin in a very different context. But God, who is rich in mercy, because of his great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ – by grace you have been saved -raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens. Because of sin we're in need of mercy. God is rich in mercy. And more than that...That in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. God is rich in mercy; God is rich in grace. God stepped in and saved us from our sin through grace. Grace in this instance means getting in right relationship with God. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; It is the gift of God; It is not from works, so no one may boast. Grace through faith. Not works. This is a point worth pausing on because historically it has been misunderstood by many Catholics. We do not work our way to salvation, it is not something we earn or ever deserve. Through faith we dispose ourselves to grace, which is God's free gift. And in grace we undertake good works, that, in turn, builds character on earth as well as treasure in heaven. Then comes my favorite verse of this passage, And this is the main verse I hope you will walk away remembering today. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them. You are his handiwork. The Greek word used here is the word ποίημα poiēma, from which we get the English word poem. It suggests the exercise of writing poetry. We tend to think

of our life as our project. But your life is not your project alone. It is a partnership between you and God, and your project is in process. However old you are, whatever your stage or state of life you're not done yet. God has more in store. And toward that end he has work for you to do. Not a check list or "to do" list. Good works that are as much about getting you have done as getting projects done. God grows us through good work. It's how together you write the poem that is your life. And he never gets discouraged by how long it takes; he is delighted every time you grow even a little. Only God can see the "best version of you," and he loves as you make progress in that direction through the good work you do. We have to choose to live in the good works he has prepared in advance for us to do. Partnering with God to discover them. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them. The good works God has prepared for you come out of who God created you to be. They come out of the unique gifts he has given you. They come out of your heart and what you care about. They come from your personality and experiences that have shaped you. The way God wired you. Broadly speaking there are three major areas of good works God has created you to undertake. The first major area: Serving in your Vocation/Career. If you are married, it means extending yourself into the life of your spouse. Or as a parent or grandparent; it means extending yourself into the lives of your children. If you are single, it means extending yourself into the lives of others who are friends and family. For everyone, in your work, in your career or business there are also good works God wants you to do too, ways God wants you to add value to others through what you do. If you are a teacher/educating the next generation, a financer/helping other people win with money. a business owner/sharing wisdom. This work is about extending yourself into the lives of those you live and work with. The flip side of this area of work brings a second. The second major area: Serving in everyday life. Every day, a hundred, hundred, hundred times a day, while living out your vocation and career, there are small, little things you can do to serve it is holding a door for another. greeting others warmly, listening to someone who is struggling/needs a friend. giving money to charity or charitable causes, being patient in traffic, gracious in the face of another's faults or failures. This work is also about extending yourself, but here, into the lives of people for whom you have absolutely no responsibility whatsoever. And then there is a third area of work that God has given us to do different entirely from the other two. The third major area: Serving in the Church Mission or Ministry some of the good work God has prepared in advance for you to do comes in working together with other Christ followers here in your Church family. That's why it is so important to actually be a part of a church community. Because there is work God has given you to do here, in your church, that you will not/ cannot accomplish elsewhere. It is coming together in service in the name of the Lord in your church family that is so impactful, so powerful: for you, for your teammates, for other parishioners and for our visitors and guests. Right now we have some excellent opportunities for you to serve in the parish. Look at them in the bulletin on page 10, pray, commit and serve. To all our member ministers: thank you for your leadership and friendship. Thank you for all your good work.... Work that God has given you, allowing you to become the best version of you can be. Allowing our church to become the best version of us we can be.

2 Cr, 36, 14-16, 19-23

En el año primero de Ciro, rey de Persia, en cumplimiento de las palabras que habló el Señor por boca de Jeremías, el Señor inspiró a Ciro, rey de los persas, el cual mandó proclamar de palabra y por escrito en todo su reino, lo siguiente: "Así habla Ciro, rey de Persia: El Señor, Dios de los cielos, me ha dado todos los reinos de la tierra y me ha mandado que le edifique una casa en Jerusalén de Judá. En consecuencia, todo aquel que pertenezca a este pueblo, que parta hacia allá, y que su Dios lo acompañe".
