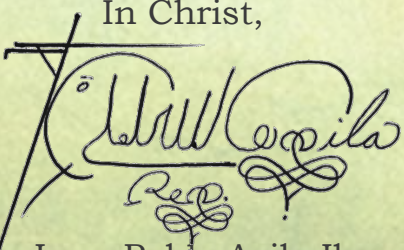
Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me will live, even though he dies." (John 11:25)

Hch 10, 34a. 37-43

Evangelio

Jn 20, 1-9

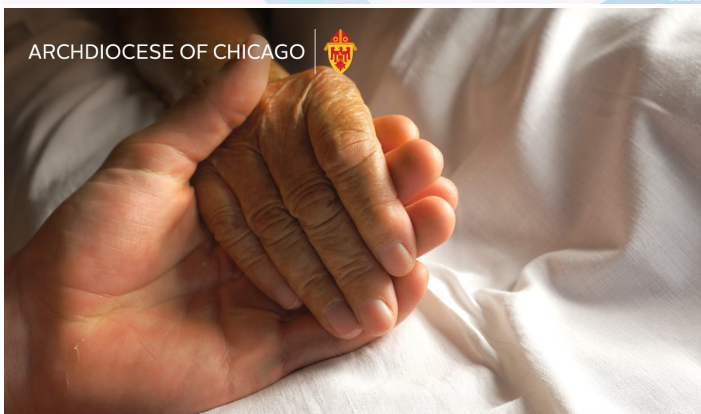
Gloria a ti, Señor Jesús

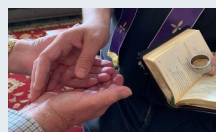
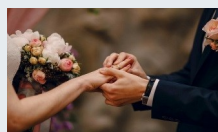
