Prayer Pillar

Transfiguration Catholic Community's Evangelization Commission has certain pillars which compose the foundations of the parish work. The prayer pillar focuses on both public and private prayer for our parishioners. The pillar does much for our prayer life such as Wednesday night Adoration of the Eucharist (where the sacrament of reconciliation is often offered to those who wish). More recently parishioners have been meeting in the Gathering Place Sunday mornings at 9:30 between masses to pray the Liturgy of the Hours Morning Prayer together for 15 minutes. Starting Sunday January 26 we will add some short prayers for the Seven Sundays of devotion to Saint Joseph.

The Liturgy and Eucharist each Sunday (and Saturday evening) are the foremost exercise of our public prayer. Each of us participates in the mass as part of the worship community. However, some of us participate more visibly, sharing our gifts at the mass.

The music and choir provide fundamental worship throughout both phases of the mass – the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist. Our choir has grown through the years so we can now provide a full choir at Sunday 10:00 mass as well as cantors and music at the other masses as well. However, we are always in need of more voices. Please see Chris O'Brien after mass to discuss participating as a member of the choir.

We have been fortunate in having men, women, and children serving as altar servers at mass. It is not unusual to have parents and their children participating together at mass. Anyone who has served the mass as an altar server can tell you that there is an appreciation of the mass from such service that cannot be acquired from any other vantage point.

Similarly, anyone who has served as an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist can tell you that after such service they are filled with the Spirit in their sharing the Body and Blood of Christ with all the faithful. We are always looking for more Eucharistic Ministers.

Additionally, every mass is made better by the service of our ushers and our greeters. The greeters allow us to know that we are welcomed at home in our church. The ushers serve the people throughout the mass.

Anyone interested in serving at the mass should see Chris O'Brien, Ken Michaels, or Mary Ann Fijalkiewicz and we can discuss training and getting you involved.

Level of Commitment:

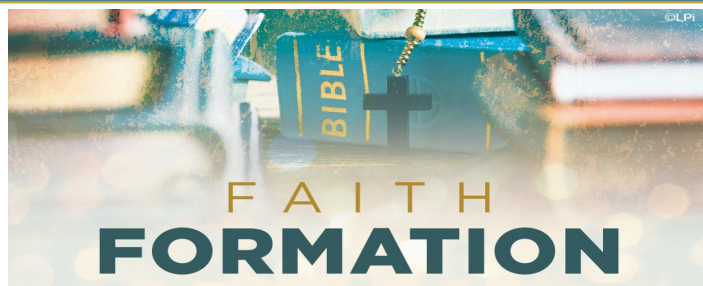
Sessions are scheduled primarily on Sundays from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. throughout the year.

Plant Your Works in the Word

One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a quiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters.

But are we mindful — truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."

We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word.

So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of God — giving it true spirit and life.

Primera Lectura

Nehemías 8, 2-4a. 5-6. 8-10

En aquellos días, Esdras, el sacerdote, trajo el libro de la ley ante la asamblea, formada por los hombres, las mujeres y todos los que tenían uso de razón. Era el día primero del mes séptimo, y Esdras leyó desde el amanecer hasta el mediodía, en la plaza que está frente a la puerta del Agua, en presencia de los hombres, las mujeres y todos los que tenían uso de razón. No estén ustedes tristes ni lloren (porque todos lloraban al escuchar las palabras de la ley). Vayan a comer espléndidamente, tomen bebidas dulces y manden algo a los que nada tienen, pues hoy es un día consagrado al Señor, nuestro Dios. No estén tristes, porque celebrar al Señor es nuestra fuerza”.

Entonces comenzó a hablar, diciendo: “Hoy mismo se ha cumplido este pasaje de la Escritura que acaban de oír”.
