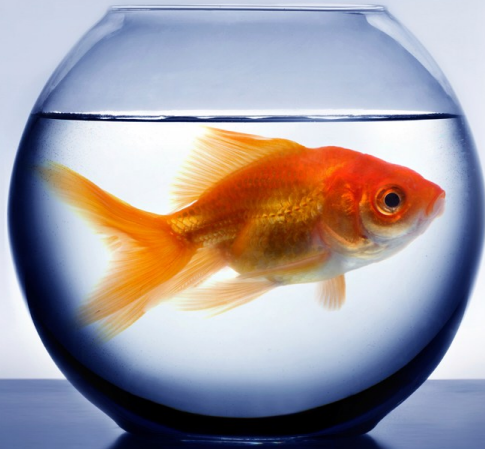

Lenten Message Series

INTRODUCTION: All we have comes from God

Scripture: Deuteronomy 26:4-10

The reading from Deuteronomy reminds the Israelites that God formed them as a people and delivered them from Egypt. They called themselves “The Chosen People” not as a badge of honor, but as a reminder that they were only a nation because of God’s initiative. Other nations had power or wisdom; the Israelites only had God’s help. **In this week will look at humility as understanding all we have comes from God.**

What does God want us to know? That we are the “Chosen People” and that we only have his help.

What does God want us to feel? We are the Lord’s and no matter what we do, He doesn’t give up on us.

What does God want us to do? Take a couple minutes in the presence of the Lord and recognize His help and generosity. This week take a moment in the presence of the Lord and say the suggested prayer for each day of the week.

The argument will be made by some that many of these things are being asked of us by others and not Jesus. Of course, that will just be another excuse like those above. For every calling upon us comes with a temptation to take the easy way out or to minimize the value of the request.

We will stay caught up in an endless cycle of excuses that lead us nowhere. That is unless we simply choose to stop the madness and say YES! This Lent, give up and give in. Let God take over as you surrender all you are and have to Him. Now is the time to turn to Jesus. No more excuses.

Una Iglesia — Un Mensaje Serie de Mensaje de Cuaresma

INTRODUCCIÓN: Todo lo que temenos viene de Dios.

Escritura: Deuteronomio 26:4-10

La lectura del Deuteronomio recuerda a los israelitas que Dios los formó como pueblo y los liberó de Egipto. Se llamaron a sí mismos “el pueblo elegido”, no como una insignia de honor, sino como un recordatorio de que eran una nación solo por iniciativa de Dios. Otras naciones tenían poder o sabiduría; los israelitas solo tenían la ayuda de Dios. **En esta semana veremos la humildad como la comprensión de que todo lo que tenemos proviene de Dios.**

¿Quen quiere Dios que sepamos? Que somos el “Pueblo Elegido” y que sólo contamos con su ayuda.

¿Qué quiere Dios que sintamos? Somos del Señor y no importa lo que hagamos, Él no se da por vencido con nosotros.

¿Qué quiere Dios que hagamos? Tómate un par de minutos en la presencia del Señor y reconoce Su ayuda y generosidad. Esta semana, tómate un momento en la presencia del Señor y di la oración sugerida para cada día de la semana.

Primera Lectura

Deuteronomio 26, 4-10

En aquel tiempo, dijo Moisés al pueblo: “Cuando presentes las primicias de tus cosechas, el sacerdote tomará el cesto de tus manos y lo pondrá ante el altar del Señor, tu Dios. Entonces tú dirás estas palabras ante el Señor, tu Dios: ‘Mi padre fue un arameo errante, que bajó a Egipto y se estableció allí con muy pocas personas; pero luego creció hasta convertirse en una gran nación, potente y numerosa. Los egipcios nos maltrataron, nos oprimieron y nos impusieron una dura esclavitud. Entonces clamamos al Señor, Dios de nuestros padres, y el Señor escuchó nuestra voz, miró nuestra humillación, nuestros trabajos y nuestra angustia. El Señor nos sacó de Egipto con mano poderosa y brazo protector, con un terror muy grande, entre señales y portentos; nos trajo a este país y nos dio esta tierra, que mana leche y miel. Por eso ahora yo traigo aquí las primicias de la tierra que tú, Señor, me has dado’. Una vez que hayas dejado tus primicias ante el Señor, te postrarás ante él para adorarlo”.
