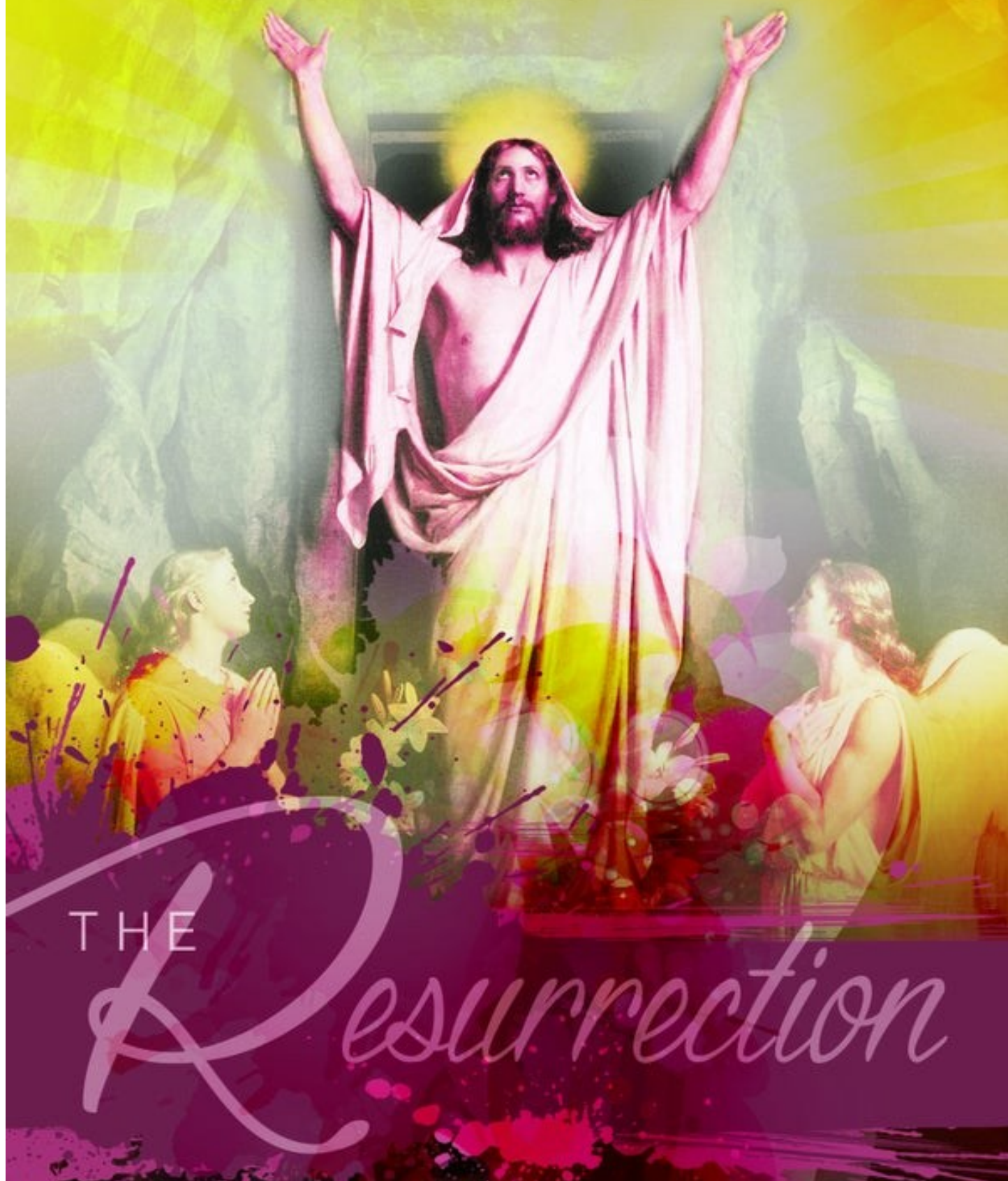

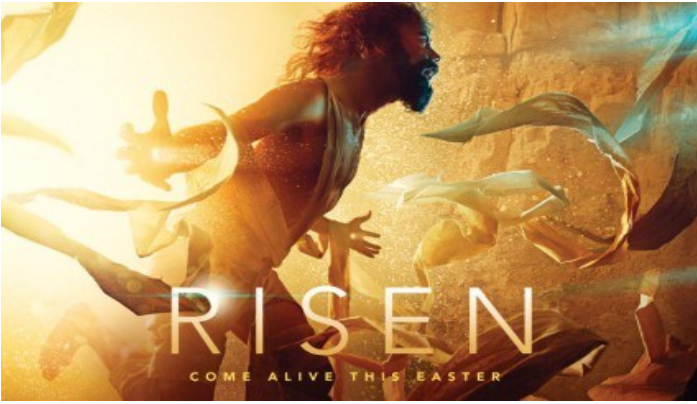

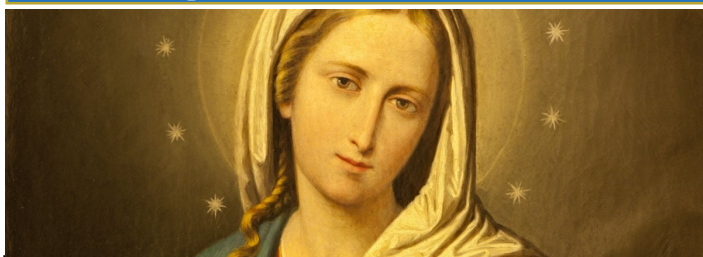

Learning Event Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary

Why do Catholics say that Mary was sinless, when the Bible says, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God"? And do we believe that Mary was assumed into heaven, when the Bible says nothing about it? Most important of all, why do Catholics give Mary so much honor? Is the Catholic veneration of Mary really "idolatry"?

Get the answers to these questions and more when you join us for a learning event on Thursday, May 22nd from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in the Old White Church (217 S. Church Street, Wauconda) for a video presentation by Dr. Brant Pitre called "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary." In this presentation, Dr. Pitre will shine the light of the Old Testament on Mary, the mother of Jesus. He shows how three ancient Jewish images help us to understand our Catholic beliefs about Mary:

The New Eve: If Jesus is the new Adam, then who is the New Eve? What are the implications of Mary's identity as the New Eve for the dogma of the Immaculate Conception?

Ark of the Covenant: If Jesus is the new Manna from heaven, then where is the New Ark? Dr. Pitre shows how Jewish beliefs about the lost Ark of the Covenant give profound revelations into who Mary is and her bodily Assumption into heaven.

The New Queen Mother: If Jesus is the new Davidic King, then who is the new Queen? In the Old Testament, the Queen wasn't the king's wife, but his mother. Dr. Pitre shows how Mary's identity as "Queen Mother" is the key for unlocking Catholic devotion to her, and the difference between honoring Mary and worshipping God.

If you are looking to understand the biblical roots of Catholic beliefs about Mary, the Mother of God, then look no further: Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary is the perfect presentation for yourself or a friend or family member who wants to understand what the Bible really teaches about the Virgin from Nazareth.

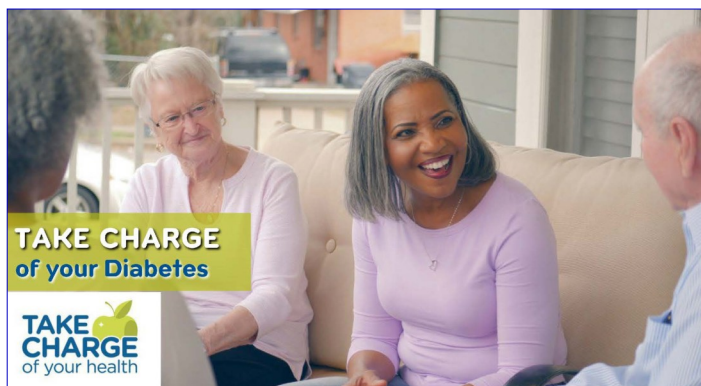

Leave It in the Tomb

Today, on the most important day of the liturgical year, the Apostle Paul is calling us out. "I see you hiding in that tomb," he says. "I see you baking with that old, stale yeast, thinking no one will notice."

He says it a little more elegantly, I'll grant you. But the message is this: If you want to be raised with Christ, you'd better be ready to step out of the shadows. Seek what is above — not what is on earth.

I can feel myself responding almost reflexively, "Great idea, Paul — but I'm pretty comfy here." Because sometimes, it's just easier to stay in the tomb. It's easier to crouch in the shadows and look outward at everyone else, thinking of the changes they could make or the sins they could overcome.

Today we are called to embrace newness. New hearts, new lives, new futures, new chances. If there's anything keeping you from that, you need to leave it in the tomb. It's a little scary, sure — maybe Jesus thought so before he stepped into the light of that first Easter morning. But no loaf of bread worth eating was ever baked using stale yeast that wouldn't rise. No new life worth having was ever lived through the broken sins of yesterday. No Easter morning ever dawned without the tomb sitting empty.

Step into the light. He is waiting for you.

Juan 20, 1-9

El primer día después del sábado, estando todavía oscuro, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro y vio removida la piedra que lo cerraba. 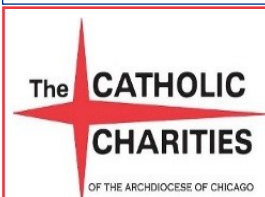
