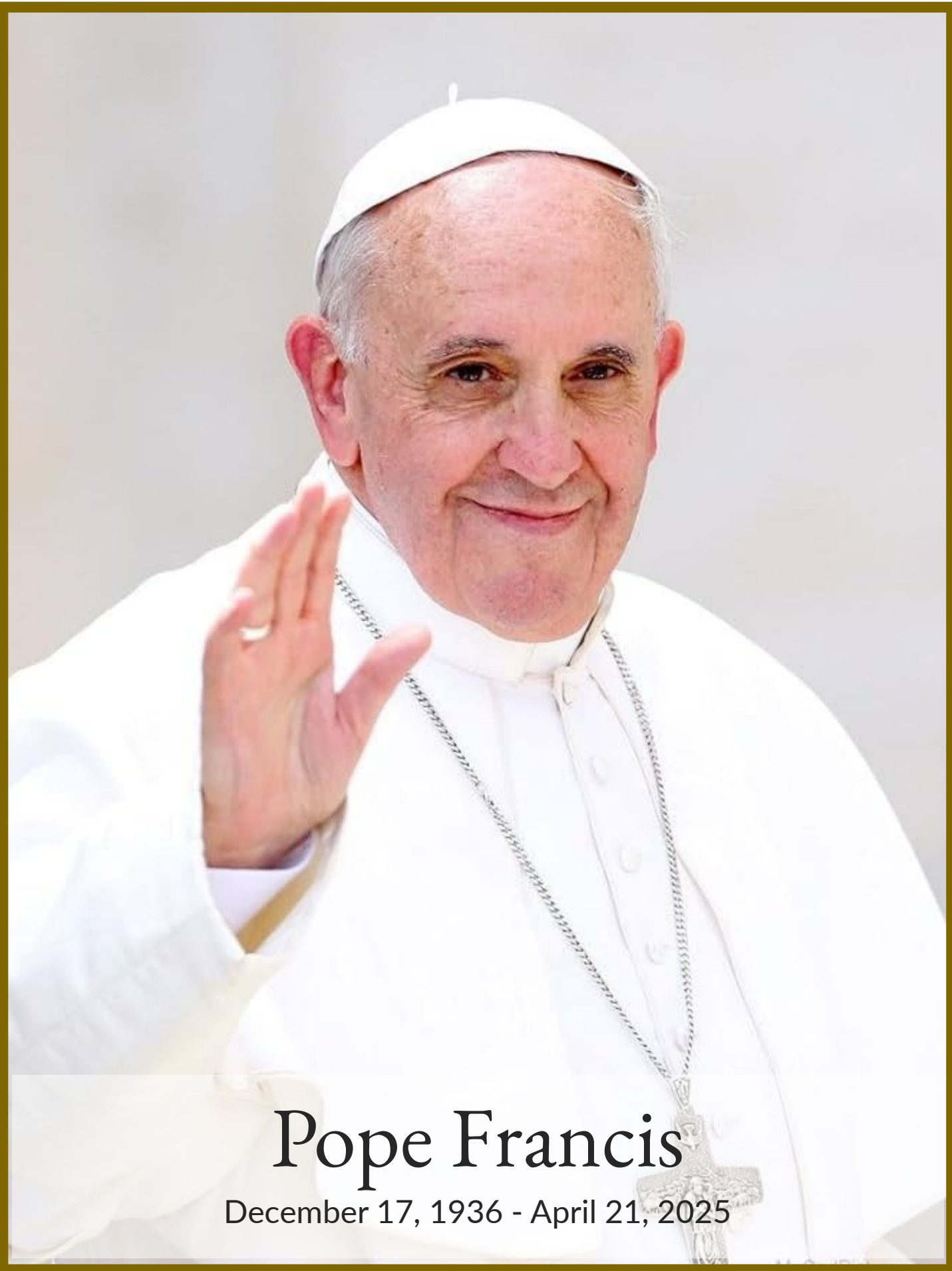

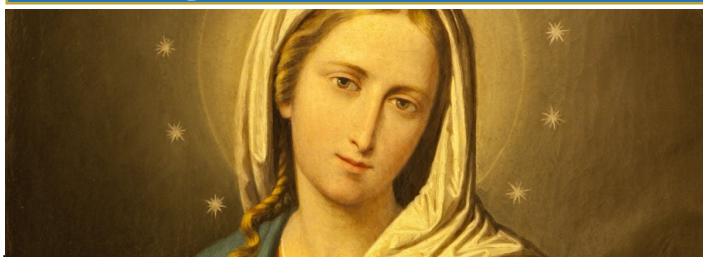

Learning Event Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary

Why do Catholics say that Mary was sinless, when the Bible says, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God"? And do we believe that Mary was assumed into heaven, when the Bible says nothing about it? Most important of all, why do Catholics give Mary so much honor? Is the Catholic veneration of Mary really "idolatry"?

Get the answers to these questions and more when you join us for a learning event on Thursday, May 22nd from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in the Old White Church (217 S. Church Street, Wauconda) for a video presentation by Dr. Brant Pitre called "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary." In this presentation, Dr. Pitre will shine the light of the Old Testament on Mary, the mother of Jesus. He shows how three ancient Jewish images help us to understand our Catholic beliefs about Mary:

The New Eve: If Jesus is the new Adam, then who is the New Eve? What are the implications of Mary's identity as the New Eve for the dogma of the Immaculate Conception?

Ark of the Covenant: If Jesus is the new Manna from heaven, then where is the New Ark? Dr. Pitre shows how Jewish beliefs about the lost Ark of the Covenant give profound revelations into who Mary is and her bodily Assumption into heaven.

The New Queen Mother: If Jesus is the new Davidic King, then who is the new Queen? In the Old Testament, the Queen wasn't the king's wife, but his mother. Dr. Pitre shows how Mary's identity as "Queen Mother" is the key for unlocking Catholic devotion to her, and the difference between honoring Mary and worshipping God.

If you are looking to understand the biblical roots of Catholic beliefs about Mary, the Mother of God, then look no further: Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary is the perfect presentation for yourself or a friend or family member who wants to understand what the Bible really teaches about the Virgin from Nazareth.

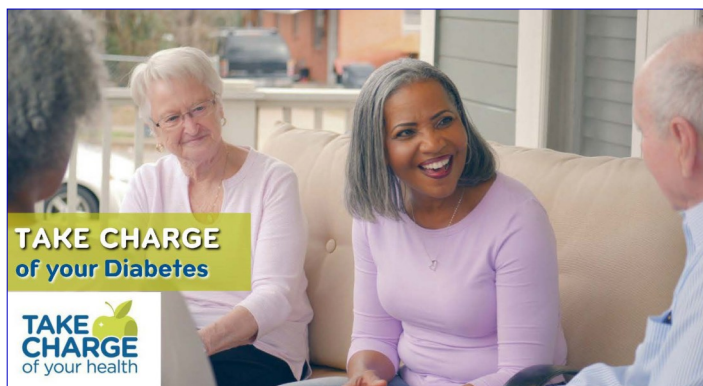

The World Is Watching

If you're a parent, you know this to be true: the world is watching. All it takes is one slip-up — one bad word, one selfish action, one uncharitable commentary, and that's the thing your child seems to notice. When he or she calls you on it, the only thing you can do is come clean. "Yep, I did that," you have to say. "I'm a work in progress, but luckily, God never stops working." I think it's fair to say that we don't think enough about the wounds of Christ. It's a little understandable, of course. Our human bodies flinch at the sight of such pain and mortification. It's a lot to handle, the physical trauma of a crucifixion. It carries an R rating in a PG world. But the wounds of Christ are the only thing that could make Thomas believe. Literally nothing else was so powerful, not even the testimony of his most trusted friends. Only by looking at and feeling the torn flesh — by beholding that messy reality — did this Apostle, this actual companion of Christ, come to believe in the Resurrection. "Christ has no body now but yours," goes the famous quote attributed to St. Teresa of Avila. What she's saying is that we have become the means through which God chooses to accomplish His will in the world. Us, the broken. Us, the weary. Us, the imperfect. Yes, miraculous events and apparitions still occur from time to time, but by and large, if a person is going to come to believe in Jesus Christ in this day and age, it will be because of something we Christians do or say. Christ has no wounds now but ours. Our brokenness, our weariness, our imperfection — our reality. It all belongs to him, and the world is watching.

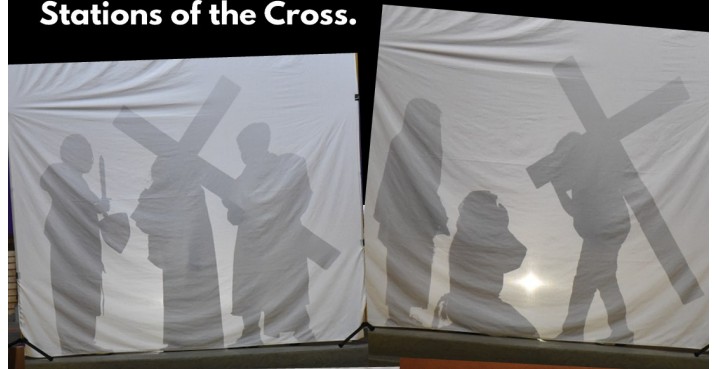

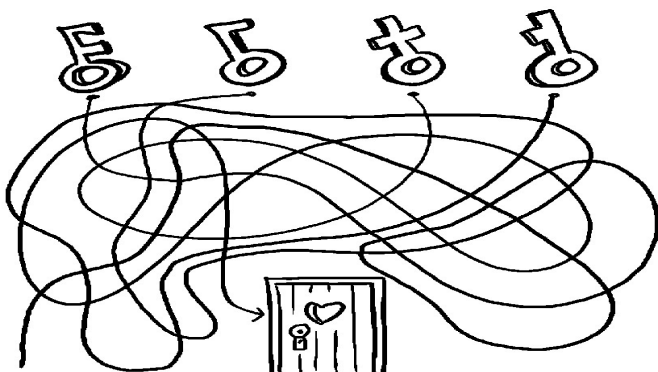

Jesús añadió: "Tú crees porque me has visto; dichosos los que creen sin haber visto". Otras muchas señales hizo Jesús en presencia de sus discípulos, pero no están escritos en este libro. Se escribieron éstos para que ustedes crean que Jesús es el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios, y para que, creyendo, tengan vida en su nombre.

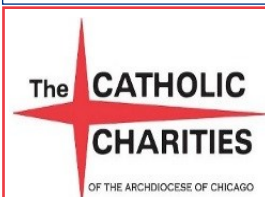
