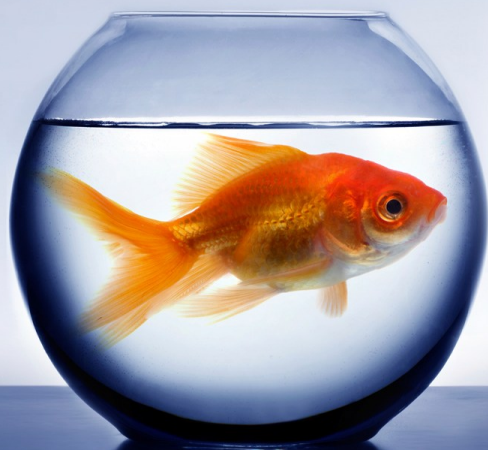

Serie de Mensaje de Cuaresma

PECADO: Dios honra a los humildes

Escritura: Juan 8

La mujer sorprendida en adulterio es humillada ante Jesús por los líderes religiosos. Jesús sale en su defensa y la exalta. Nos humillamos ante Dios para recibir su consuelo y bendición, y así, con el tiempo, él pueda exaltarnos. Dios da gracia a los humildes, pero se opone a los orgullosos.

¿Qué quiere Dios que sepamos? Que cada vez que nos humillamos ante Dios, recibamos este consuelo y bendición, para que con el tiempo él pueda levantarnos. «El Señor es mi fuerza y mi escudo; en él confía mi corazón, y soy socorrido; por tanto, mi corazón se alegra en gran manera, y mi alma lo alabará» (Salmo 28:7).

¿Qué quiere Dios que sintamos? Que cuando pasemos por pruebas que intenten sacudirnos profundamente y hacernos caer de rodillas, dejándonos con una sola cosa que decir: "Gracias, Dios, por todos mis contratiempos, Tú eres la razón por la que puedo recuperarme". A veces, Dios tiene que quebrantarte para reconstruirtte.

¿Qué quiere Dios que hagamos? Escucha la canción "Tú me levantas". Sé el instrumento que Dios necesita para levantar a alguien que está desmoronado.

Isaías 43, 16-21

Esto dice el Señor, que abrió un camino en el mar y un sendero en las aguas impetuosas, el que hizo salir a la batalla a un formidable ejército de carros y caballos, que cayeron y no se levantaron, y se apagaron como una mecha que se extingue: “No recuerden lo pasado ni piensen en lo antiguo; yo voy a realizar algo nuevo. Juan 8, 1-11

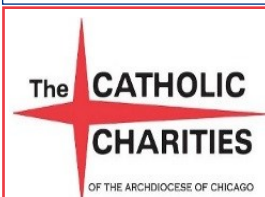
