"To spread the joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis wants believers to double-down the practice of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Within a faith community, I find joy in preaching a Gospel message that promotes sponsorship as a sign of divine mercy to the children of the poor. I cherish the opportunities Unbound is giving me to proclaim joyfully that sponsorship is a concrete sign of God's mercy."

Father George Knab is a Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate living in Belleville, Illinois. Pope Francis has renewed Fr. Knab's designation as a Missionary of Mercy — along with 895 others globally — in order that each may be a "Joyful proclaimer of divine mercy and its faithful dispenser." Previously serving as director of religious services at a Buffalo, New York, Catholic high school, hospital chaplain in Indianapolis and pastor in South Carolina and Florida, he promoted outreach to poor communities in the developing world. Currently he conducts Bible studies at a soup kitchen and his parish mission collections now support Oblate seminarians in Zambia. Father Knab has written a booklet of bedside Eucharistic devotions.

El Padre George Knab, es Misionero de los Oblatos de María Inmaculada y vive en Belleville, Illinois. El papa Francisco ha renovado su nombramiento como Misionero de la Misericordia — junto con otros 895 en todo el mundo — con el fin de que cada uno pueda ser "una fuente de fe y con júbilo proclamar la divina misericordia". Con anterioridad, el padre Knab fue director de servicios religiosos en una escuela secundaria católica de Búfalo, Nueva York; capellán de hospital en Indianápolis y, sacerdote en Carolina del Sur y Florida, donde promovió el compromiso con las comunidades en el mundo en desarrollo. Actualmente, conduce estudios bíblicos en un comedor de beneficencia, y las colectas de su misión parroquial, apoyan a los seminaristas de los Oblatos en Zambia. El padre Knab ha escrito un folleto de cabecera con oraciones eucarísticas.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Have you ever paid attention to the purification of the sacred vessels after Holy Communion? If you haven't, I highly recommend doing so this Sunday. See the care with which the priest handles the chalice and the paten, pouring water into them to cleanse any loose particles of the Body and Blood of Christ. Observe the loving reverence he uses in wiping them dry with a special purificator. It's a ritual unto itself, and a powerful moment for reflection. These vessels begin as earthly objects. They are made by human hands. There is nothing special about them — not until they go about the work for which they have been created. Until they contain the Body and Blood of Christ, they are only ordinary objects. But after they have carried within them the Eucharist, they are never the same. They will always be special and deserving of special care. That's why partaking of the Eucharist is, for us, an evangelical undertaking. It is both a transformation and a declaration. When we accept this tremendous gift, we are proclaiming what we believe, and we are accepting the grace to follow through on that commitment. When we are receiving the Eucharist, it is not possible for us to be passive. We become the vessel. We carry Christ into the world with us. But do we act like it? Do we treat ourselves — our bodies, our souls — with the same respect as the priest cleansing the chalice? Do we treat one another with the reverence we would reserve for a sacred object? When we look at another person with anger or irritation or envy, do we acknowledge the change that we have willingly undergone by receiving Christ's Body and Blood into ourselves?

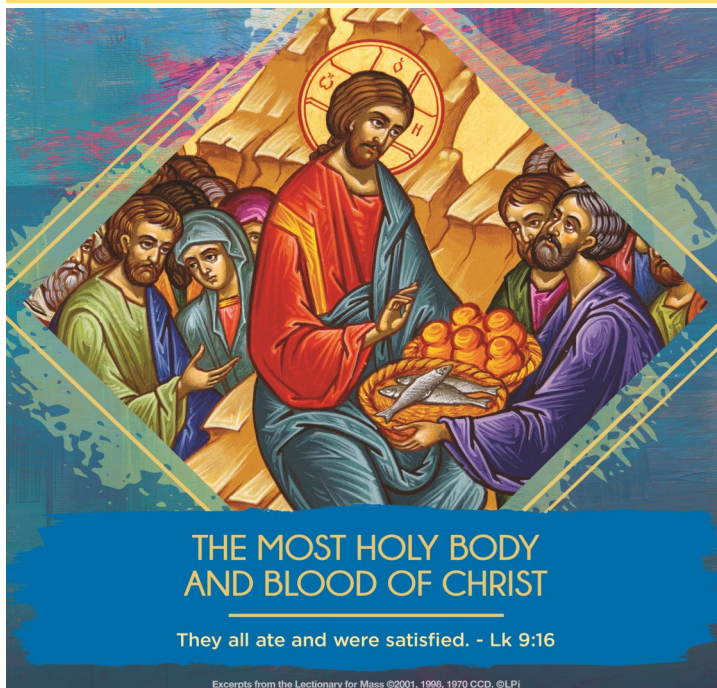
Gloria a ti, Señor Jesús

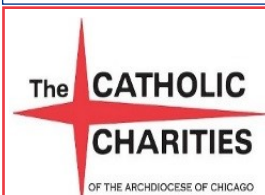
