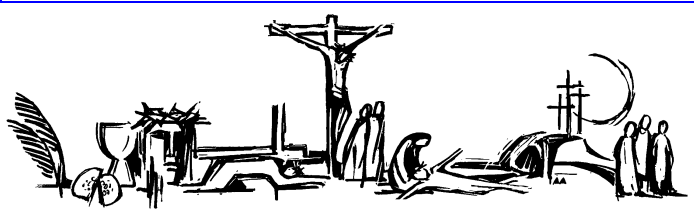

Lenten Message Series

WEEK FIVE: **Grief and Loss**

Scripture: John 11: 3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

The ultimate pain or wound is death. It separates us from our loved ones and leads to grief and loss. Jesus came to heal the world of the pain of grief and death. The raising of Lazarus from the dead and his own resurrection prove that Jesus is the resurrection and the life. His healing can be so complete that it even conquers death. Jesus accomplishes an incredibly miraculous healing with very little effort. All he does is pray a quick and simple prayer to his Father and tell Lazarus to come out.

What does God want us to know? Healing is real, but it does not always happen on a preferred timeline. Delay does not mean indifference, and unanswered prayers are not signs of abandonment. God works for deeper and more lasting restoration, even though grief, loss, and frustration. Jesus understands sorrow intimately, enters into it fully, and reveals that resurrection and new life are stronger than wounds and even death. Healing is meant not only for personal restoration but also for revealing God's love to others.

What does God want us to feel? Reassured, comforted, and strengthened. There is permission to grieve honestly, to feel disappointment, and even to express anger in prayer. There is hope in knowing that pain is seen and shared by God, that suffering is not meaningless, and that perseverance in faith matters. There is encouragement to trust that healing, in some form, is still unfolding.

What does God want us to do? Persevere in prayer and trust God's timing, especially when healing feels delayed. Bring grief, anger, and disappointment honestly to God rather than withdrawing or giving up. Take part in the healing process by cooperating with grace through prayer, community, and acts of faith. If healing has been experienced, share that story so others may find hope and courage. Become a source of healing for others, remembering that healed people help heal people.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

When I am driving throughout the United States, I enjoy seeing the billboards that dot the highways speaking for God. A couple of my favorites: "Life is short. Eternity is not. --God"; and "Let's meet at my house this Sunday, before the game. --God." God must have a pretty big advertising budget because he has billboards in pretty much every state!

One billboard I saw read, "You asked God for a sign, and here it is!" After a chuckle, I realized that we are always looking for a sign. We say we believe, but sometimes, we act like we just want to be sure.

In the Gospels, Jesus performs miracles and healings so that people would believe. The healing of Lazarus was surely a profound moment for all who were there. Jesus was able to show that he has power over even death itself, a foreshadowing to his resurrection that will occur in the not too distant future. For all who doubt, be assured that Jesus is the giver of life. He has given living water to the woman at the well, sight to the blind, and now has raised a man from the grave.

As Easter draws ever closer, how many more signs do you need? What else can Jesus do to convince you that his call on your life comes from the source of all life? As the US Bishops' pastoral letter on stewardship lays out, we have been challenged, we are asked to choose, and then our lives will be transformed. May all the signs of God around us, even billboards on the side of the road, move us to choose a path of giving of ourselves like Jesus.

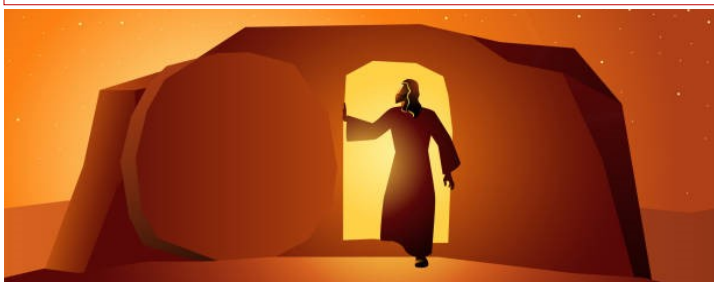

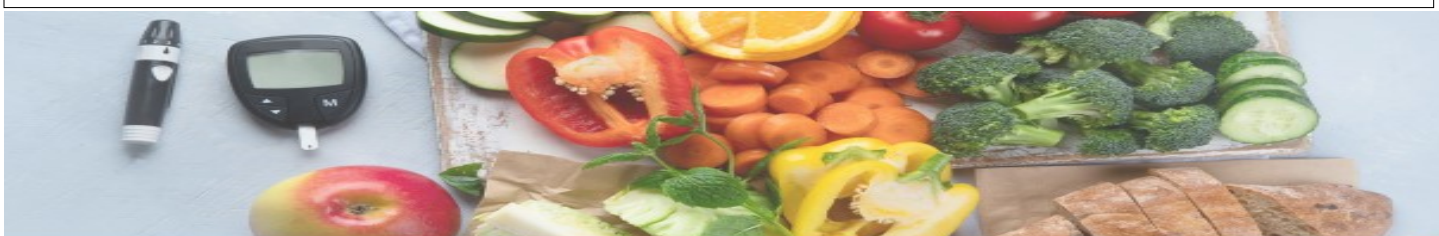
Before Confession: Prepare by making an Examination of Conscience

A prayer before Confession: Dear Jesus, help me to make a good Confession, help me to find out my sins, help me to be sorry for them, help me to make up my mind not to sin again. Have mercy on me, O Lord, and forgive me. Mary, my mother, pray for me.

During Confession: Greeting: Make the Sign of the Cross in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Say: *“Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been ____ (weeks, months, years) since my last confession.”* Confess your sins using the Examination of Conscience. If you are unsure of what to say, ask the priest for help. When you are finished, conclude with these or similar words: *“I am sorry for these and all my sins.”*

Penance: The priest will propose an act of penance. The penance might be a prayer, a work of mercy, or an act of charity. He might also counsel you on how to better live a Christian life. Act of Contrition: Say an Act of Contrition, expressing sorrow for your sins and resolving to leave sin behind and live more like Jesus Christ. Say: *My God, I am sorry for my sins with my whole heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. With your help, I firmly indent to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.*

Absolution: The priest then blessed you in the person of Christ as he says the prayer of Absolution which frees you from your sins. After Confession: - - Rejoice that through the grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation God has reminded you of his unending love! Follow through with the penance the priest gave you.
